DES MOINES WOODTURNERS MEETING (AAW Chapter meeting) Saturday, September 12th, 1:00 p.m., at the Woodsmith Store, 10320 Hickman Road, Clive, IA.



Sorby representative **Jeff Farris** will present an extended September meeting. Jeff has focused his career on sharpening education since the early 1990s. He has worked in trade shows, workshops and woodturning schools to teach the value of truly sharp edges on woodturning tools. He joined the Robert Sorby team in late 2012, but has been using Robert Sorby tools exclusively in his demonstrations from the very beginning. His straightforward presentation demystifies both sharpening and turning and has been praised by turners ranging from beginners to the very experienced.

Start each turning project with sharp tools and you will see a dramatic improvement in your results. Jeff will open the demonstration with a discussion of sharpening techniques, tool profiles and bevel angles. He will be demonstrating the Robert Sorby ProEdge sharpening system, but the fundamentals apply to all sharpening methods.

Moving to the lathe, Jeff will present a brief outline of turning fundamentals with an emphasis

on tool presentation and how it affects efficiency and surface finish. Building on those fundamentals, Jeff will explore some of Robert Sorby's more innovative tools.

Surface treatments lead today's trends in artistic turning. Jeff will demonstrate Sorby's wide range of decorative tools and show you how to get the most out of them.

We'll have a brief discussion about upcoming elections and additional open volunteer positions. She also explained and demonstrated how a variety of kit projects can be made on a pen mandrel and covered the various drill bit sizes used, bushing styles and sizes, and tools needed to make pieces fit well. Thanks for a great job Donna!

In addition, other types of mandrels were shown to make turned disks for non-tubular projects including those that fit in a Jacobs chuck, 4-jaw scroll chucks and others that attach directly to your headstock spindle.

Over the course of six months prior to the fair we also had others who turned a variety of products to sell at the fair and still others who assisted with hauling items to and from the fairgrounds and assisted with set-up and tear-down. A rough tally of items sold exceeded 1,000 individual wood turned products with Spurtles, Tops and Weed Pots leading the way. That was approximately a 250% increase over last year.

Greg and **Kat Ellyson** from Iowa City kindly donated a batch of brightly colored Christmas tree ornaments, tops and bowls plus Greg was a production turning machine on Thursday, cranking out even more tops & trees while Kat & others did the selling. **Rob Beattie** was again our top notch pitch man to all who would listen.

Thirty six individuals signed up to learn more about woodturning and nearly 100 application forms were picked up by visitors to the booth. It was interesting to hear how many gals wanted their hubbies to get involved with woodturning and how many men indicated they had lathes passed down from their father or they had purchased at sales and auctions, yet hadn't turned them on for decades. There were also quite a few women who were genuinely interested in getting into woodturning. Scores were invited to attend our September meeting as a guest.



GET READY FOR 2015 FESTIVAL OF TREES and LIGHTS – CONTINUING THE TRADITION



Nearly every year since the event began in 1984, the creative work of area turners, carvers, scroll sawyers and other woodworkers has been pooled together to create and donate ornaments for a 7 ½ ft. evergreen tree to be displayed at the Festival of Trees and Lights, which supports programs of the Blank Children's Hospital in Des Moines. The Festival has raised over \$7.6 million through the sale of the displayed trees and other holiday decor as well as admission to the event. The wooden-ornament-tree displaying our collective talents has been a mainstay of the annual fundraiser, and is typically among the most highly-sought trees at the benefit auction held prior to the start of the Thanksgiving-weekend display.

Please consider crafting and finishing one, two, or a few items for use in decorating the 2015

edition of this tree. Dozens and dozens of traditional tree décor items such as Santas and snowmen, icicles, balls and bells, deer and other woodland creatures, penguins and other birds, camels and bears, trees, tops and toys of all descriptions are needed. And, of course we'll need garlands and something special for the top of the tree. Items should be light-weight and include a small eyelet or other means for our decorators to secure them to the tree with wire. Items can be dropped off in the designated box at the Woodsmith Store or at October and November Des Moines Woodturners, Mid-Iowa Wood Carvers, and Des Moines Woodworkers meetings. The drop-off deadline is Saturday, November 14.

We hope you'll also plan to attend the Festival of Trees and Lights November 25-29 at the Veterans Memorial Community Choice Credit Union Convention Center Ballroom to see this and the dozens of other trees created especially for this event.



FOR SALE - Rockwell Model 46-111, SN JI 1179, gap bed lathe complete with faceplate for outboard turning. Note there are spindles on both sides of the head stock allowing over the bed turning or outboard turning of larger diameters.

Accessories can be purchased separately including what is believed to be a duplicator, a Handy Collet chuck and a Child brand Coil Grip chuck. In addition there is a set of Rockwell turning tools and several individual turning tools. They are likely older carbon steel tools rather than modern High Speed Steel (HSS).

The seller also has 5 or 6 one inch thick walnut boards approx 6 ft long by 7 inches wide.
