
Due to the length of the two presentations, president Paul Miller postponed the showing of several tables of Show and Tell items. Please bring your items back and we'll try it again in February.

NEW DISCOUNT SUPPLIER – You've often heard woodturners mention how they've created finials or other parts of a turning to look like Ebony. The most common method is to use a dye. Alcohol based leather dye is especially effective at giving a deep, penetrating solid black look. A local source will provide our members with discounts on all their products. Their name is Tandy Leather Factory at 5041 NE 14th St. It's north on NE 14th St., Exit 136 off I-80/I-35. Take the first right into the shopping center and it's to the south of Bomgaars (used to be a K-Mart years ago). That's across the street from Montana Mike's Steakhouse. Their hours are 8 till 5 Mon thru Fri and 8 till 3 on Sat. It's available in black as well as other colors you might find interesting.

WORDS TO TURN BY - Some Light Along the Path - Glossary of Woodturning Terms

Woodturning has its own language, like every field of endeavor. Some words and concepts may be familiar depending on one's background in woodworking, but many of the terms are specialized, and frankly, a bit strange-sounding! I want to focus on some of the more common terms one is likely to encounter whether reading columns like mine, or watching demonstrations. An alphabetical listing seems to be as good as any, and so I will begin at the beginning! While this is by no means an exhaustive listing, I will try to cover the most useful. Here's the first one.

<u>Banjo</u> - This is the part on the lathe which slides along the bed and supports the tool rest. The banjo utilizes a locking mechanism to hold or clamp the tool rest base in place as needed. Most units use a simple cam/lever mechanism which rotates a plate or bar into place along the length of the banjo. (The banjo is one of the things you should test when looking at a new lathe—does it move smoothly and lock easily along the bed at various angles, as well as how solidly does it lock in place?)

The banjo needs to provide a solid support for the tool rest, and it should accept standard diameter tool rest shafts. The banjo needs to be able to be moved out of the way (or removed completely) when sanding, finishing, or carving. With the mini/midi lathes the banjos are often a weak link in terms of locking capacity or holding capacity, so be aware of their limitations.
