Ten days later Mike received a letter from AAW Secretary Norm Hinman welcoming the Des Moines Woodturners as the 158<sup>th</sup> Chapter of the American Association of Woodturners.

We've invited the founding officers to join us and share a moment or two of their early experiences.

Today, there are approximately 350 AAW Chapters around the world with the majority in North America. Since our inception we've brought in some of the biggest names in woodturning (Bob Rosand,, Bonnie Klein, Nick Cook, Steve Sinner, Jimmy Clewes, and Trent Bosch) to provide seminars & workshops. We've also been fortunate to have our local pros share their talents with us at our monthly meetings. **Rob Wallace** and **Brian Simmons**, who have also demonstrated on the national stage, have regularly shared their woodturning skills and knowledge with us along with a host of other accomplished Chapter members. Our thanks to all who've shared their woodturning experience over the years. We hope more members consider sharing by demonstrating and serving our membership in the future.

Of course we'll have our regular Show 'n Tell for both Beginners, Students and all others. Everyone is encouraged to bring an item they've turned, big or small, finished or unfinished, and share your experience with our members. We'll also continue a voluntary critique session for those who would like to learn what others see in their turned objects, both pro and con. It's a great way to make advances in your work. #### BASIC WOODTURNING CLASS - Our eleventh Basic Woodturning class was just completed by



Maurice Herold of Indianola and Jim Reynolds of Clive, pictured below. Dan Carlson, of Urbandale, started in a prior class but a medical emergency forced him to drop out. With the death of Pat Patterson, Dan was able to return and complete his class. Frank Neer of Des Moines, not pictured, will be finishing up his classes as he recovers from a

recent illness. Rob Beattie announced that the next Basic Woodturning class will start sometime this coming fall and any members interested in taking it should contact him for class requirements. #### INTERMEDIATE WOODTURNING CLASS - HAND CHASING THREADS - On April 2<sup>nd</sup>, four



students attended a one-day hands on workshop where they learned the various methods of threading wood including hand chasing threads. Using specific species of wood, or synthetic material, hand chased materials can easily be adapted to lids and vessels without the expense of investing in a mechanized threading attachment.

Students cut both male and female threads and one mating pair from PVC pipe using hand thread chasing tools. In addition, with student assistance, they were shown how to use large taps to cut headstock spindle threads and Oneway live tail center threads in cross-grain hardwood. This process is done manually on the lathe without the motor running. Creating threaded blanks provides a handy way to make custom adapters to hold a variety of projects on the lathe.

Students were **Donna Byers**, **Mike Lustig**, **Jim Pierce** & **Tad Tadlock** (Yes, the instructor forgot to take a class photo)

Students also hand chased threads in a piece of Corian and found it to take threads very easily. At the end of a long half-day class, students built their own recessing tool used in making female threads. Instructor Dick Meuler commented that the students far surpassed expectations in being able to cut accurate threads after minimal instruction. Hand chasing requires lathes capable of operating at variable speeds between 200 and 400 RPM.

No other one-day workshops are currently scheduled but some have shown an interest in small hollowing projects such as hollowing globes for Christmas tree toppers, branch hung ornaments or even small vessels. #### MONTHLY MEMBER NETWORKING at the Scout Center on




