

Des Moines WoodTurners IMPORTANT – VOLUNTEERS NEEDED

As you each know, our non-profit educational Chapter is an all volunteer organization. We rely on our members to pitch in and contribute their time and talents for the good of the organization.

For at least the past four years, a small handful of volunteers have been doing the bulk of the heavy lifting to put in place the essential components of a successful organization. Due to their combined efforts, the Chapter is now on solid footing in all respects.....except for one. We haven't developed the next generation of leaders to carry on the work of the chapter.

It's past time to recruit and train our next generation of leaders. Those of us with the Chapter administrative experience and knowledge of Chapter operations are very willing to train and assist volunteers during the transfer process. We'd also like to spread the workload out to more people to lessen the load on any one individual. Here's what we need most:

<u>Vice President – President Elect</u> – train under the current president to preside over monthly Woodsmith meetings, create Board meeting agendas, and other activities assigned to this leadership training position. In 2018, lead the organization as President.

<u>Database Manager</u> - provide a robust versatile membership database that can interface with word processing documents in a mail-merge function to create nametags, membership cards, form letters, and more. This individual would collect registrations for seminars and workshops, create e-mail and USPS mailed hard copy to members and work closely with the Treasurer by making fund deposits. Individual must have adequate computer skills and be a good communicator. If you have these skill traits, we really need your assistance.

<u>Treasurer</u>- Maintain the Chapter finances, reconcile banking statements, prepare board meeting financial reports, submit all required government filings, and other activities normally associated with the office. Individual must have adequate desktop/laptop computer skills, preferably some accounting background and be a good communicator.

<u>Committee Chairs</u> – multiple individuals to plan and coordinate various educational and community service events such as all-day demonstrations, workshops, community demonstration events, Festival of Trees, State Fair booth operation, and more. Let us know your strengths and talents and we likely have a place for you.

<u>Individual Volunteers</u> – members to learn and help operate cameras at meetings, join a refreshment committee, meeting set-up helpers, meeting tear-down helpers, meeting greeters, hosts to escort visiting demonstrators, etc. Our sincere THANKS to all who have been lending their helping hand.

<u>Backup Volunteers</u> – Not everyone can make every meeting during the year. That's why we'd like to have more backup help for all of our positions. It also allows sharing the workload which makes any task easier.

<u>Meeting Demonstrators</u> – Our Chapter now has over 150 members yet less than 10% volunteer to provide an informative monthly demonstration of something they've found of interest in woodturning. Volunteer to show how you make a specific project. We can put together meetings where up to three demonstrators can each get in a short demo. Please volunteer to give back by sharing your learning experiences with others through our monthly woodturning demonstrations.

So there you have it. We need <u>YOU</u> and the life skills and talents you can lend to our Chapter for the betterment of the organization. Please don't hesitate. Volunteer now so we can continue our work in educating woodturners to work safely within their skill level, while providing a networking environment and educational opportunities for woodturners of all skill levels.

Brian indicates he'll cover drawing, dimensioning, layout, stock preparation and replicating along with turning beads, coves and pommels. Brian is an outstanding demonstrator and presenter. This past summer Brian demonstrated at the AAW national symposium in Atlanta, GA. By attending this demonstration you're sure to come away with knowledge and tips you can use in your shop.



Stuart Batty all-day Demonstration

When: Saturday, November 5, 9:30 - 4:00

Stuart is a third-generation woodturner, being a full-time production turner and teacher in his father's studio at age 16. At 19, he started working for Craft Supplies in England, at the time the world's largest supplier to woodturners. During his 6 years at Craft Supplies, he was the in-house woodturning teacher and demonstrator. He set up Craft Supplies' first sawmill and was in charge of their import business that sold more than 300 exotic woods around the world. Stuart also developed and tested woodturning tools for Robert Sorby, a Craft Supplies sister company.

During the past 34 years, Stuart has taught more than 3,000 amateur and professional woodturners. He has demonstrated and taught in 12 countries and for more than 200 AAW chapters throughout the US. Stuart's style of

work is greatly influenced by his background as a spindle turner with precise cuts and sharp detail. He uses very simple tools and tool shapes to create his pieces. His work is pure lathe work, with no carving or surface texturing.

Stuart's artwork has been sold through prestigious galleries across Europe and the US. He also has artwork displayed in the permanent White House collection. Stuart believes we have only skimmed the surface of the potential of a wood lathe. With production woodturning as his background, his foundation in woodturning helped him perfect the push cut style and other useful techniques, such as negative rake scraping.

Demonstrations by Stuart Batty

Perfecting the Art of Cutting - Learn the art of cutting without torn grain. Stuart will show how to make perfect cuts with the three main gouge types - bowl, spindle, roughing - and chisels, including skews, parting tools, and beading tools. Included will be the simple way to freehand grind each of the tools, allowing it to perform at its best for all wood types. He will break down the cuts in to simple movements that everyone can learn - how the right hand controls the tool, the left hand assists, and the body movements that make cutting easier and repeatable.

Bowl Turning with the 40/40 Grind - The 40 degree bevel and 40 degree straight swept back wings on a bowl gouge make this the most versatile tool you can own. This demo will show you how to freehand grind the gouge on a platform and the motions used make repeatable cuts with little physical effort and no torn grain. Stuart will show how this gouge is controlled for both spindle and bowl turning.

Seven Setup Fundamentals - Every cut requires correct setup, and there are 7 very important setup rules that eliminate the variables in woodturning. Following these rules makes turning safer, easier, and more fun.

Items can be dropped off any time prior to the deadline at the Woodsmith Store or bring them to our October 8th or November Stuart Batty demo on November 5th. The drop-off deadline is Sunday November 13th.

We hope you'll also plan to attend the Festival of Trees and Lights November 23-27 at the Veterans Memorial Community Choice Credit Union Convention Center Ballroom to see this and the dozens of other trees created especially for this event.
