SPECIAL BATTY DEMONSTRATION SERVES AS OUR NOVEMBER MEETING Registration deadline has closed.

NOVEMBER 5th - STUART BATTY DEMONSTRATION - Often described as the best technical



woodturner in the world, Stuart (Stu) Batty's demonstration will serve as our November meeting, however we're holding it a week earlier than usual. Stu predicts the over seventy (70) registered attendees will learn to become better woodturners while also making their woodturning more enjoyable. WOODSMITH STORE PARKING

HOW BATTY HANDS-ON WORKSHOP TURNING BLANKS WERE PRODUCED

You start with a savvy wood buyer like **Jack Rolison** who sniffs out a supplier of fresh-cut Cherry of adequate size and volume. He schedules it to be harvested, then slabbed out the day before he schedules us to pick it up. Led by Jack, who lives in Ottumwa, two groups of Chapter volunteers (**Rob Beattie/Dave Yearian** plus **Tom Baker** and self) drive the 200 plus mile round trip to southern lowa and load the fresh cut Cherry on a 17 ft trailer, owned and pulled by Tom. The load was towed back to **Chuck Dowler**'s garage in Norwalk. Rob had arranged with **Mike Lustig** to meet us upon arrival and help unload the wet, heavy timbers onto a sheet of HD plastic spread out on Chuck's floor. Slab sections were either 4" x 4" or 4" x 7" and 12 to 14 ft long. They weighed over 1,300 pounds in total. Once unloaded and stacked, the bundle was enclosed in plastic and tape sealed to retain moisture until a later cut date. Just over two weeks before the workshops, Rob Beattie organized a cutting party. They proceeded to make over 800 cuts on Chuck's bandsaw to break down the slabs and cut the corners off all the cross-grain blanks. So when you see one of these guys in the group photo below along with Jack Rolison, say **THANKS** for volunteering to make the workshops possible! Left over Cherry blanks will be sold at the November 23rd Scout Center gathering.

AAW SCHOLARSHIPS AVAILABLE - AAW is pleased to announce we are continuing to offer financial assistance for quality woodturning instruction. Scholarships will be awarded to selected AAW chapter members to attend classes at one of three craft schools. The AAW Endowment Trust Fund (ETF) in combination with the three schools provides funds for these scholarships.

Fourteen scholarships will be awarded to <u>Arrowmont School of Arts and Crafts</u>, Gatlinburg, Tennessee. This scholarship offers tuition only for courses directly related to woodturning. Room, board, and travel expenses are the responsibility of the scholarship recipient.

Ten scholarships will be awarded **John C. Campbell Folk School**, Brasstown, North Carolina. This scholarship offers tuition only for courses directly related to woodturning. Room, board, and travel are the responsibility of the scholarship recipient.

Four scholarships will be awarded to <u>Anderson Ranch Arts Center</u>, Snowmass Village, Colorado. This program offers tuition, and room and board in dual occupancy dorm rooms for courses directly related to woodturning. Travel is the responsibility of the scholarship recipient.

- ◆ Scholarship nominees must be current AAW members and be chosen through a process authorized by their AAW chapter officers. Guest members and those whose AAW memberships are lapsed or expired are not eligible.
- ◆ Chapters will be allotted one nomination for the first fifty AAW members in the chapter. After that, each additional fifty AAW members will allow another nomination.
- ◆ If more members are nominated than the total number of available scholarships, a drawing will determine the winners.
- ◆ All awards will be for courses in 2017.

Submit your name and 1st, 2nd and 3rd choice of school to attend by completing the information below and getting give it to Dick Meuler at any meeting between Nov 5th and Dec 10th, or E-mail to Dick Meuler at dmwoodturners@gmail.com or mail to Des Moines Woodturners, 10050 NE University Ave., Runnells, IA 50237. Our chapter deadline to submit your name into nomination is Saturday, December 10th,1:15 p.m. On that meeting date, two names will be selected by a random numbered ticket drawing that corresponds with each name entered. We will submit our nominees to AAW prior to their entry deadline. AAW will notify winners by December 31, 2016. Remember, you must be an AAW national member to apply.

We encourage scholarship winners to present a monthly demonstration within a year after they return to share their new found knowledge with fellow Chapter members.

What is Sketch Up? - Sketch Up is a 3D modeling computer program for a wide range of drawing applications such as architectural, interior design, landscape architecture, civil and mechanical engineering, etc.

This class is designed to provide the basic skills of Sketch Up and show how it can be used for any kind of woodworking project – flat work as well as turned projects.

What do you need to know prior to taking the class? Only one thing – where the Woodsmith Store is!

What to bring to class?

A laptop that you have already downloaded Sketch Up 14 (or higher) prior to the class.

A mouse – corded or wireless. (Very important!)

A pad and pencil (for taking notes should you desire to do so).

Your questions and a desire to learn about getting started in Sketch Up.

What if I don't have a laptop? Come anyway. You may have to share with someone who does. Please do NOT let that stop you from attending!
