This will not be a T-Shirt or automotive artist type course, but instead tailored to **coloring wood**. And no, you don't need to be 'artistic' to utilize an air brush in your shop.

TAX TIME COMING SOON - TAXES & GIVING (Source: http://www.smartgivers.org/taxes and giving)

Make sure your contribution is tax-deductible. All 501(c)(3) organizations can accept contributions and offer donors a tax deduction to the full extent of the law. Make sure to ask an organization if they are a 501(c)(3) organization before you make a donation.

How to receive tax-deductions for your charitable donations: To claim deductions, you'll need to fill out the tax form 1040 (the long form, which allows you to itemize deductions on Schedule A). You can find it at the IRS website. You don't receive any tax breaks if you fill out the short form or take standard deductions.

Gifts of clothing or household items (equipment, tools, accessories, books, videos) will be deductible only if the items are in "good used condition or better." Single items for which the donor has received a qualified appraisal and taken a deduction of more than \$500 are not subject to this rule. Nor are food, paintings, antiques, art objects, jewelry, or collections.

Contributions of cash, checks, or other monetary gifts, regardless of amount, must be substantiated by a bank record or a written communication from the charity showing the name of the charity, the date of the contribution, and the amount.



Deductions for volunteering: Although you can't deduct the value of time or services donated to an organization, you can deduct any costs that are incurred during volunteering, such as gas mileage or the cost of a volunteer uniform.

Gifts of stocks and other securities: The best stocks to donate are those that have increased in value and that you've held for more than a year, particularly those producing a low yield. In order to preserve tax advantages, it is critical that the securities themselves are transferred to an organization rather than proceeds from a sale.

Appreciated Securities or Mutual Funds- If you donate securities that have increased in value, you pay no capital gains tax and are entitled to a charitable education for the full fair market value of the stock.

Depreciated Securities- Rather than contributing depreciated stock, sell the stock and contribute the cash for a charitable deduction.

IRS DETERMINATION PROVIDES FULL NON-PROFIT 501(c)(3) STATUS – Just a reminder that effective January 7, 2014, the IRS recognized Des Moines Woodturners Inc. as a non-profit organization. Organizations that are exempt from taxation under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code are some times referred to as "Charitable Organizations. The word "charity" is used as a "catch-all" for simplicity's sake. Section 501(c)(3) describes groups organized and operated for one or more of the following purposes: charitable, religious, educational, scientific, literary, testing for the public safety, fostering national or international amateur sports competition, or the prevention of cruelty to children or animals. In our case, we applied as an educational organization and specifically, Adult Education. So our primary mission and reason for existence is to provide woodturning related education to our members in a variety of fashions.

Being given this status provides our Chapter with several important benefits.

- 1. Donations accepted (cash, equipment, tools, accessories, wood, rent, buildings, property, etc.) from individuals, retailers, distributors, manufacturers, estates & others are 100% tax deductable by donor under nearly all circumstances. Receipts are provided to donor upon request.
- 2. Participate in public and private activities only open and available to IRS recognized non-profit organizations.
- 3. Ability to apply for grants and other public or private allocations available only to IRS-recognized, 501(c)(3) organizations.
- 4. Be eligible for discounted advertising rates, including possible free TV and radio public service announcements (PSA's).
- 5. The public legitimacy of IRS recognition.



Donations to Des Moines Woodturners Inc., a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization, are 100% tax deductible under most circumstances. Please consider us in your estate and tax planning.

ABOUT JOE FLEMING - Woodworking provides me with an outlet for my creativity. I enjoy finding a piece of wood, envisioning what it can become, and then transforming it into a beautiful art or craft piece. I make both art pieces and functional pieces, but I always strive for beauty. My woodturning consists of all types of turning disciplines including bowls, hollow forms, platters, vases, boxes and furniture components. I use a variety of wood species in my work including local urban forested woods like eucalyptus, and other reclaimed wood. I also use wood from certified forestry projects in the Pacific Northwest, Mexico and Australia.



I have been an amateur woodworker for over 40 years and an amateur woodturner for more than 15 years.
