

Remembering Chuck Dowler

Dec 14, 1936 – Nov 10, 2018



Few people have impacted the Des Moines Woodturners as much as Chuck Dowler did. If you were a woodturner, you knew or knew of Chuck Dowler. If he didn't get you into woodturning, he certainly helped you to become a better turner. I know this because of the influence he had on me. He was an educator, an encourager as well as a tremendous inspiration to all who knew him....*Tom Whalley*

"When I joined the Club, I was nearly the only "Girl" in a predominately "boys" club. Chuck was very accepting and welcoming. Chuck was anxious to teach others about the joy of woodturning. I have missed him at our functions... Donna Beyers

Chuck was my early mentor and then continued as a great woodturning friend. He is a large part of why there are so many Woodturners in central lowa. He and his wife Peg were always great hosts to those of us attending his Wednesday morning social... Bob Blank

I first met Chuck at Rob's shop. When talking with Chuck he made you feel like you were the most important person in the room. He had the greatest teaching style, which never made you feel he was teaching down to you, just that he was adding to your current knowledge. That is a gift.

There was not an organized beginners' class when I first joined the club eager to get started. Chuck took me under his wing, invited me to his shop and patiently tutored me on the fundamentals. Even though he told me what tools to buy, I goofed up and bought a spindle gouge without a handle. Not a problem for Chuck. The first thing he taught me to turn was a tool handle! I decorated it with 3 grooves at one end (C...the 3rd letter in the alphabet) and 4 grooves at the other end...(D, for Dowler). I will always treasure that tool and the memories it represents of learning from Chuck. Perhaps the earth turns a little bit eccentrically with Chuck's passing. I will miss him... Vikki Morain

He was a very kind person. I didn't know him well but the couple of times I talked with him it was evident that he liked to help people... Nan Sloan

Before I started turning, I was building a baptismal font for my church and needed a piece turned to fit the metal bowl I was using, he invited me to shop and did the turning for me. Probably sparked my interest to start... Steve Sutton

Chuck was the first person in the DMWT to help me with turning. I spent part of a day with him in his shop as he showed me how to turn a small hollow globe. He was kind and patient and an inspiration, and I will miss him...Mark Foust

Chuck Dowler was a wonderful man, teacher, mentor. As Education chair, he guided Patty and I through what tools and equipment we needed to start turning, he went as far as walking us around the Woodsmith store and advising us what and more importantly what not to buy, as well as loaning us some of his personal tools while taking the beginner class. Chuck was always willing to help with turning and was always a pleasure to visit with. He will be missed...walter & Peggy Smith

Chuck had a major influence on my turning in that he emphasized traditional elements such as no painting, cutting or gluing. I never got into turning eggs but his use of eggs to show the diversity and beauty of wood sent a clear message. He was always safe and technically sound in his turning...Roger Nass

Chuck nudged me into taking my first hands-on class ever with Jimmy Clewes. He said we could take the class together and he would help me if I had any problems. What a great experience! Chuck taught me how to turn his signature tree ornament, which I still make to this day. I think of Chuck every time I turn one. He gave me a lot of wood and acrylic when I was getting into woodturning. Chuck was a great mentor who will be truly missed...Greg Ellyson

Chuck taught me how to turn and got me interested in the various aspects of turning. Was awesome having him as an instructor...Dan Chodur

I was very lucky to be in Chuck's first or second class of turners. He called me and offered the course. It was extremely fortunate for me to get a complete and comprehensive course, the equal of any I could imagine elsewhere. The price, if I recall correctly, was only the cost of materials. Later Chuck was always available to answer questions and offer helpful tips. He was a great person and an asset to wood turning...Hugh Morris

Chuck will always be remembered as "that guy with the booming voice" who was one of the outstanding leaders the Des Moines Woodturners - one who made arrangements over many years for nationally-known woodturners from around the country to come to our meetings and do demonstrations and hands-on classes for us. Having those demonstrators come to Des Moines to provide our members multiple opportunities to advance their skills will always be a legacy we can attribute to Chuck and his unwavering support of the chapter, its members, and the AAW. I find it both somewhat spiritual and entirely consistent that the day and time of his passing was at the same time the Des Moines Woodturners were beginning their monthly meeting - he has simply gone to a different meeting. *Many thanks Chuck! The Des Moines Woodturners need your help!

I am asking for your assistance to serve on a committee or to assist with the various projects our club will be involved in the coming year. I have defined three general areas where you can volunteer. They are: 1) Help with our club meeting day activities, 2) Pre-State Fair activities and 3) Volunteer to help in our booth at the Cultural Center during the 2019 Iowa State Fair which runs from August 8th through the 18th. Working with others within our club is a great way to get to know each other and to discover common interests.

The attached document outlines the duties of each of the various committees. By checking the "if interested" box, you are NOT volunteering to be in charge of the entire committee, but would be willing to help on these committees. Our club really needs you to step up to the plate in some way to help our club function.

State Fair activities

We have been very fortunate to have a large booth in the Cultural Center at the Iowa State Fair to demonstrate to the public that turning wood can be very fun and rewarding. Throughout the year, our members make over a dozen different products that we sell during the fair to support various club program. This is our major fund-raising activity, and it really needs the help of many volunteers.

The work starts by hauling, stickering and storing sawmill slabbed tree sections for drying. Later, we break those long slabs down to manageable size and distribute the wood to various member's shops. Work parties are then organized to create specific product blanks in each shop by way of table saws and bandsaws. The blanks are bundled and stored by product type for additional drying and later distributed at Scout Center meetings to members willing to turn and finish the final products for sale.

Education

We are a non-profit organization formed for the purpose of adult woodturning education. This year we plan to upgrade all the training lathes and actually add to the lathe count to accommodate eight students or hands-on workshop attendees. In addition to our basic skills training classes, we hope to expand the courses to include specialty classes focusing on specific woodturning techniques. We are also looking to bring in at least one well known professional turner for a one-day seminar plus several one-day hands-on workshops.

None of the committees I have listed will require a great deal of your time – most are a one-time activity, or assistance at a club meeting that you will be attending anyway. Please get involved. We really need your assistance. Check as many of the boxes as you would like to – but please check at least one box.
