FEBRUARY'S PROGRAM: SEGMENTING 101

Member **Harold Haines** has been creating beautiful segmented wood turnings since 1991. At our February Chapter meeting, Harold will show and explain how segmenting is done without a massive investment in tools and equipment. He will show setting a miter saw to a proper angle, cutting the wedges used in creating the rings and checking the angles for accuracy. Since our Chapter has started a new Special Interest Group specifically geared to those members interested in learning this craft, Harold's program could not be timelier. You might want to bring a note pad. Members who have done segmented work are encouraged to bring pieces they have done – even if is your very first attempt at segmenting. Harold promises there will be plenty of time for questions.



Of course, we'll have our monthly **Show 'n Tell** so plan to bring your projects or woodturning related items to show, **regardless** of your current skill level. Members like to see the work of others at all skill levels and hear about the challenges you faced creating your project as well as how you overcame them.



World renowned woodturner Cindy Drozda is coming to Des Moines!

Cindy Drozda, international demonstrator, teacher, writer, and producer of instructional DVDs, will be putting on a seminar at the Woodsmith Store on Saturday, May 4th. She will be discussing finial design, making a lidded burl bowl with a natural edge without the star points as shown on the Finial Star project shown on the right. It will be colored using the same technique as I used in the Finial Star. The seminar will be informative and



inspiring. Also, during this seminar (if there is time), Cindy will demonstrate a Triangular Box, (pictured to the right) which combines multi-axis and basic box-making techniques. Using multiple centers, a triangular shape is created on the lathe. You will see the layout technique and some ways to use it to enhance turned projects. Along this one-day journey, some valuable tips and techniques will be presented that can be applied to many of your future projects, so bring several pens and a full tablet of note paper to capture as much information as you can as you will quickly discover the amount of information is enormous.





One of the many benefits to bringing in demonstrators of this caliber is being able to get one-on-one turning instruction with a well-known pro at your side. We have scheduled Hands-on Workshops for May 5, 6 and 7, during which you will discover what an excellent teacher Cindy is as well as experience her detailed techniques first-hand. In each of these workshops, the subject will be Cindy's most popular workshop subject, her signature Finial Box. (pictured on the left). As Cindy will go through the techniques and procedures involved in this project. Students will also get one-on-one time with Cindy as she moves through the steps to create the Finial Box. You will want to sign up early to reserve your spot as there will only be eight slots per workshop available. JANUARY MEETING REVIEW – Mounting your project on to your lathe!

In spite of our first major snowstorm of the season, the Des Moines Woodturners were able enjoy a great and informative program presented by Will Zitterich, Dave Yearian and Tad Tadlock. There are many different ways a piece of wood can be mounted on the lathe. Dave and Will had just about every piece of equipment one could imagine used to mounting a project. They did an excellent job either explaining their use or actually demonstrating how to use them when mounting

various pieces and sizes of turning blanks. Tad finished the program by mounting a beautiful example of a very natural and



quite oversized piece of wood on the lathe and doing some rough turning. However, in order to accomplish the mounting, and after attempting to chisel off corners to allow it to rotate on the lathe, Dave came to the rescue with his chain saw. I think this was probably the first time a chain saw was used to "shape" a piece while it was mounted on the lathe. Needless to say, **Rob Beattie**, the Education Director, was well – um ... I think the picture says it all! You can look now, Rob, Dave's done cutting. He took his chain saw home with him. Will and Tad will try to have the pieces they started turning finished for the February meeting.

Prior to the program, **Rob Wallace** introduced the members to the art of critiquing their own woodturnings. After a handout was passed out, he went through the 5 times when one can critique their own work. During the turning process; During the embellishment process; during the sanding/prefinishing process; critiquing your finishing process; and finally critiquing the final piece. 
