## **APRIL'S PROGRAM: FINISHING THE BOTTOM OF YOUR BOWL**

How do you finish the bottom of your bowls? How do you hold your turned bowl in order to turn the bottom? How do you sign your work? Did you realize that other than turnings like the Calabash bowl, all bowls, hollow forms, and boxes have a bottom, a flat, a foot or a stand? This is the portion of real estate on your project that has untapped potential and can be an entirely different design than the item itself. Even if you made a graceful shape with that perfect curve and flawless finish the average person will still pick it up and turn it over to look at the bottom.

This month member **Glen Farmer** will explore multiple ways to finish turn the bottom of your bowls. "Using a little design and some technique I hope to open up your perception that your bottom isn't just something you sit on."



Glen will show strategies for reverse mounting of the bowls based on what materials people have. From there, he will expand on ideas of different bottoms that can be created by each mounting technique all while using a couple of specialty tools he uses to make life easier.

Of course, we'll have our monthly **Show 'n Tell** (on **our** new tables) so plan to bring your projects or related items to show, regardless of your current skill level. Members like to see the work of others at all skill levels and hear about the challenges you faced creating your project as well as how you overcame them.

**CRITIQUING YOUR WORK** If you would like to have your show and tell item critiqued, stop by the "Critique" table after our monthly Chapter meeting. By providing you a helpful critique, it's hoped this will provide feed-back to improve your future work and assist you in developing new ideas. #### MARCH MEETING REVIEW – Making lidded boxes

Member **Dave Yearian** began the demonstration by describing a number of magazine articles which may be used showing how to make a box on the lathe. The articles explain the typical step by step process used to make boxes. At the state fair this year, our Chapter will be selling boxes to fairgoers made by our members to promote woodturning. Turning a box on the lathe gives the turner an opportunity to be creative and display their own artistic flair. Using wax or friction polish for the finish is quick and provides a suitable finish to enhance the box's appearance. Walnut and butcher block oil are also good to use. Two ways to hollow the inside are by using a drill bit or a hollowing tool. Dave

demonstrated the use of a face plate or waste block and double stick tape to hold the piece on the lathe for turning. He also showed the importance of using good double stick tape to secure the wood. Using a steb center to hold

the wood block, he turned it round with a spindle gouge. He then used a parting tool to define and separate the top from the bottom of the box. A drill bit was used to create the inside of the bottom and a gouge to create the inside of the box top. Dave put the top in a scroll chuck and created a recess for a Corian insert. He added accent rings around the bottom and top of the box and burned in lines on the top. He then turned the top to fit the bottom and glued in the insert. He put the top and bottom together and applied a finish while it was turning on the lathe. Please plan to bring some boxes you created for **Show 'n Tell** for the April and May monthly meetings.




