OCTOBER'S PROGRAM: Rick Hutcheson -

After time in the Army, member Rick Hutcheson opened a grocerv store, then an ice cream shop. He got back into carpenter work again in 1980 (having learned it from his grandfather when he was much younger) and eventually bought a scroll in 1988, a tool Rick has certainly mastered. Then in March of 2006, he purchased a wood lathe. He says that started a whole new hobby and found that the lathe can be a lot of fun once you start learning how to use it. Rick probably has more bowls in his garage than Walmart has in their warehouses - the only difference is that Rick made his himself - out of wood.

Have you ever wondered just how to turn a log or square piece of wood round and *without* a band saw, Rick will have the answer.

He will cover mounting the "chunk" of wood on the lathe, what

tools to use, how to use those tools, and how to do it safely. If you do not have a bandsaw but still want to learn to turn wood, this is a good demo for you also. Rick plans to make a small wing bowl and a bowl from a "nonround" piece of wood.

SEPTEMBERS'S PROGRAM by Will Zitterich

Members **Dick Meuler**, **Dave Yearian**, and **Brenda Rekenthaler** led a group discussion to talk about the State Fair entries submitted by members last month. The panel asked the turners to tell what their inspiration was to make the piece, some of the challenges they faced and how they overcame those challenges.

Members in attendance learned a little more about some of the things the judges consider when judging pieces. Here are some of the comments Brenda shared from the judges:

- One of the first thing turners (and judges) do is look at the bottom to see how it was finished, so finish the bottom!
- If finishing your piece with a high gloss finish, it needs to be rubbed out to be smooth and without any scratches.
- Make the wall thickness even and a little thinner on the side walls of a bowl and a little thicker at the bottom.
- Don't wait until the last minute to finish a piece as it may mean you have to take shortcuts that will not enhance the appearance. In fact, it may be very obvious this happened.
- Threaded lids must fit well on threaded pieces.
- If you can get your finger inside a hollow form, make sure it is finished well and smooth.
- Don't over analyze a piece too much, just put it on the lathe and turn it.
- If your vessel has a finial, make sure they look good together. Otherwise leave the finial off.
- The base should be just large enough to look like it will properly support the piece, but not be too small to make the piece look top-heavy or unbalanced.

One turner overcame the challenges of worm holes by filling them with dyed sawdust. Another turner found the value of using wood hardener when hollowing out a difficult vessel with a number of voids. Another used black fabric in his piece.

The turners that showed their pieces were: Tom Whalley, Rob Beattie, Charles Tadlock, LeRoy Monson, Alan Foust, Jack Kennedy, Donna Byers, Vikki Morain, Tom Baker, Mike Hamilton, Del Kramersmeier, Dick Meuler, Wendell Shellabarger, and Dennis Lind. Phil Laudenklos displayed a beautiful mahogany table with carvings on the legs which was judged to be the Best of the Show.

- 1. Choose an unturned blank that is typical of what you turn. Weigh it and a finished object of similar size, using kilograms as your unit. Divide the weights—half, a third, a quarter, a fifth—to estimate the weight of typical fragments.
- Convert the diameter of your blank and object to meters and multiply by π (3.14) to get their circumference.

5. Find the kinetic energy (the energy of an object in motion) of the potential projectiles by multiplying mass times velocity² times ½, or ½mv². In other words, plug the velocities and the estimated weights of various fragments into the following formula:

 $0.5 \times \text{kg} \times \text{m/sec}^2 = \text{joules}$

(Notice that, in contrast to mass, velocity affects kinetic energy exponentially.)

- 6. Compare the numbers you get with the following figures:
 - 4.4 joules: the impact standard for American faceshields
 - 15.5 joules: the impact standard for European ("high energy resistant") and Australian and New Zealand ("extra high impact resistant") faceshields
 - 111.1 joules: the impact standard for American riot helmets
