### DECEMBER'S PROGRAM: Tom Whalley and Will Zitterich



Member **Tom Whalley** will demonstrate how he creates his own face plate as well as a tail stock support piece out of wood completely on the lathe by drilling and cutting the threads using commercially available tools. Member **Will Zitterich** will demonstrate how many of the faceplates and chucks are used in woodturning. Many attachments are available to make the use of faceplates and jamb chucks more useful and expand

the options available to the woodturner. Using the available attachments and adapters enables the woodturner to make their own faceplates and jamb chucks to fit their individual projects. They are instrumental in removing

tenons from the bottom of the bowls, holding irregular objects, providing additional support to the object being turned, and assist the woodturner in doing more accurate turning.

### NOVEMBER'S PROGRAM: Stacy Nehl



Stacy Nehl, a member of the Corridor turning club in Cedar Rapids, demonstrated how she does her woodburning enhancements on her turnings by first making an index grid on a turning to make it easier to keep the burned design symmetrical and minimize the free hand burning. She also demonstrated a free hand burning of wings on a vase and transferred the design onto the vase using Chaco or graphite paper. She recommended using a wood burner like Razortip wood burners and a few basic pens and suggested the need for three types of pens; skew, ball tip, and shader tip. They can be kept clean using a strip of leather. Bass wood and lighter woods work best for woodburning except ash is problematic and walnut is a little too dark. She also described reverse burning and using Foredom tools and micro motors for relief

carving and using acrylic paints and oil based colored pencils.

### CHUCK DOWLER MEMORIAL WOODTURNING SCHOLARSHIP



### A WARNING ABOUT ADVICE!

#### Pete Moncrieff-Jury considers whether all advice is good advice

This may prove to be a bit controversial, but I make no apologies for what is coming. As an experienced woodturner I firmly believe that anyone starting out in woodturning, or, any other craft, is entitled to and should expect to get help, instruction and advice from suitable, reputable sources. This article is used with Kind permission of GMC Publications WOODTURNING magazine and was written by Pete Moncrieff-Jury December 2019 Issue 338, Page 104 Metric dimensions have been converted to approximate inches for U.S. reader clarity.

Recently on social media, a very experienced professional woodturner brought to my attention a supposed online training video on how to use a skew that was, at best, a total waste of time and, at worst, potentially dangerous. On another occasion a new turner innocently asked, on social media, what wood was good to practise on and was inundated with advice from supposedly more experienced turners. That advice ranged from dense close-grained exotics to anything that was free, including old fence posts. Again, not exactly sensible and possibly enough to cause a new turner to give up when a piece of 4" x 4" fence post filled with nails he had innocently mounted on the lathe refused to turn into something beautiful, ruined his tools and potentially could result in hurting himself too.

#### **PROMOTING GOOD PRACTICE**

Don't get me wrong, there are some excellent sources of instruction and advice on the web, but unfortunately there is sufficient dangerous and ill-informed information to cause anyone who is new to the craft frustration, heartache and possible serious injury. Sadly, many believe that if it is online, it must be true.

Exaggeration? Not really, and if you are new to your craft how are you supposed to know that turning a bowl with a spindle roughing gouge is dangerous or that pushing a ten-inch diameter log through the bandsaw with bare hands is not really advisable. Should a novice turner know that grinding that file to make a scraper is perhaps not a good idea and could result in a visit to the hospital?

With little or no sensible supervision of what is posted online in social media in particular, we all need to be aware of the potential dangers and be prepared to advise and guide new turners towards good quality, safe sources of advice.

There are excellent turners out there who use videos to display and instruct novices and other experienced turners in both basic and advanced ways to do things- more power to their elbows. Let's promote them but also recognise the inherent danger in our craft and make sure all of us accept responsibility in highlighting dangerous advice when we see it as well as promoting good, safe practice.

#### RESPONSIBILITY

Far be it for me or anyone to suggest that everything on social media and video channels is dangerous or wrong, but those of us who do post have a responsibility to make sure that we are clear in what we are demonstrating and sharing and we all need to make sure that we are perhaps willing to comment when things crop up that are not safe.

For example, would you advise a new turner to start with a piece of wood that had known cracks or natural voids in it? Or, perhaps show someone how to turn a bowl with a skew and a spindle roughing gouge – or worse, using a chainsaw? I have seen all these things online.

To those of us who have experience, these things are perhaps just seen as something that is stupid and to be avoided, but for the new turner in particular looking for advice there is an assumption that this is the way to do things.

If we are honest, we all develop bad habits and do things that at times aren't safe but we all have a responsibility, I believe, to both show good practice if posting online and be prepared to warn others when we see dangerous practices displayed or bad advice given.

I believe that Chapter functions at the Scout Center and monthly demonstration meetings at Woodsmith fall into the same teaching, training and information dissemination discussed in the article above. Experienced members should correct misinformation being given or demonstrated at any Chapter event. Further, the selection of demonstrators should be limited to those that have shown, or are known, to be in accordance with generally accepted woodturning techniques for the type of demonstration they present to our membership.
