

Veteran's Administration Pen Turning Program Assistance - By Dick Meuler

The Central Iowa VA won a grant that provided them with two lathes, beginning tools and accessories along with 100 pen kits. Our Chapter agreed to provide assistance in setting up their program and teaching several of their Recreational Therapists about the pen turning and assembly process. That training was completed in May and June while navigating Covid safety guidelines by providing temperature checks, wearing of face masks, social distancing, and complete sanitizing at the conclusion of each session.

The VA has since announced the reopening of their out-patient therapy programs and asked us to start running veterans through the program beginning in July. The same safety precautions will be taken and the groups, including instructors and veterans, will be nine or less per day on selected Wednesday afternoons each month.

Members **Dan Carlson**, **Jim Gunning**, **Dan England**, the Van Osdel family and **myself** have contributed wood for pen blanks as shown in the photo below. **Donna Byers**, **LeRoy Monson** and **myself** have drilled out the blanks and so far, I have been able to cut the blanks to size and glue in brass tubes to give us an adequate starting supply. There may become a time when we will need a hole drilling and tube gluing party at the training center, but for now we are good to go. We are providing ready to turn blanks to the VA to save time during their sessions.

Since the lathes obtained by the VA did not come with stands, the Chapter agreed to purchase a stand for the one housed at our training center, along with a lockable tool box that is bolted to a base that is bolted to the back legs of the stand. This will allow the VA to store all their tools, pen blanks, pen kits and accessories right on the lathe that is temporarily being housed at the Chuck Hass warehouse in our training center area. Special **THANKS** to **Stan Merrill** and **Donna Byers**. Stan arranged the purchase, picked up, assembled, added large locking casters, and transported our donated stand to the training center and mounted the lathe on it. He has since lowered the height of the lathe stand twice. Donna trained the VA recreational staff on the pen assembly using the pen press system that came with their grant. Both Stan and Donna have been a big help in getting the therapists trained in all aspects of lathe operation, tool use and pen making.

After going through the training, one of the therapists commented that woodturning is perfect for vets to get their mind concentrating on the process and act of making the pen and being creative with the shape, color contrast and fit of the pen kit components. They expect there will be a large demand to attend. We will soon find out. In the process, we may find that some would like to pursue woodturning beyond pen making and join our ranks as members.
