WOODTURNING TRAINING NEWS

We're entering the heart of winter with snow cover and extremely frigid temperatures. It's the perfect time to be planning for late winter and spring training classes at our training location in Valley Junction area of West Des Moines.

For over 12 years, our Chapter has conducted basic training classes in the late winter/spring and again in late fall/early winter. This year we're teaching four Basic Woodturning classes in March and April with each being two days, 1 week apart, to allow time for homework practice to be completed between class days. Specific equipment, tools, PPE and accessories are required for students to attend. Each will have their own Jet 1221VS lathe station. As of this writing, we have seven (7) students registered and being assigned their 2-day class dates. This is a pre-requisite class for all other training classes taught by our training team members. If you haven't yet taken it, and your turning creates more chips and dust rather than ribbons of cleanly sliced wood, you need this class. Get your name on our Stand-By list immediately to make sure you're early in line for a cancellation or a class next fall. Fee is only \$30.

In May and early June we'll be conducting four <u>Basic Bowl Turning</u> classes teaching cross-grain turning. We have several openings remaining. To attend you must be a Chapter member and have completed our Basic Woodturning class. The only additional tool required is a 3/8" or 1/2" HSS bowl gouge, of reasonable quality, that has been properly shaped and sharpened for general cross-grain turning. New tools don't always come shaped for general use. We can help you get it that way. Your parting tool, spindle gouge, scroll chuck with wood worm screw, outside caliper, and face shield meeting ANSI Z81 or higher specs from the Basic Woodturning class, are also needed. Below are 10 possible class dates and we'll narrow it down to one per week by picking common dates students can attend. Fee is only \$15



Class 1 on Mon May 10 or Tue May 11

Class 2 on Mon May 17 or Tue May 18 or Thur May 20

Class 3 on Tue May 25 or Thur May 27

Class 4 on Mon Jun 7 or Tue Jun 8 or Thur June 10

To sign-up, send me which dates you CANNOT attend. We'll then pair up students by which common day in a given week they can attend. Contact me at 515-991-8111 (10a to 10p) or e-mail me at dmeuler@gmail.com

<u>Deadline to sign up is Saturday, April 17th</u>. Don't delay. The earlier you sign-up, the higher you'll be on the standby list.

NOTE: We **will continue our COVID protocol** in all classes by limiting attendance, **requiring appropriate face masks** and taking forehead temperature readings upon entering the training center. You'll be asked to sanitize your hands upon entry and before you go to your lathe station where you will be required to complete a liability waiver and pay your class fee by cash or check. You'll be asked to observe reasonable distancing during demonstrations and while taking personal instruction. For safety from distractions, only instructors and paid students are allowed during class. To protect feet from a dropped tool, sturdy enclosed shoes are required. No open-toed, canvas or cloth footwear.

NEW TO WOODTURNING AND NEED HELP GETTING STARTED?

Getting started in woodturning is not just picking up an old used lathe, acquiring some decades old bargain garage sale tools and whipping out a project using an inappropriate and dull tool to shape a rapidly rotating piece of dry Osage Orange timber. This would not be either a safe or enjoyable experience. Beyond learning woodturning jargon is the task of selecting equipment, tools, and accessories to insure you invest wisely and give yourself a reasonable chance at learning a new skill. Learning woodturning takes practice. Lots of practice. But it should all be enjoyable, rewarding and done safely. That is our goal for you.

Tool steel has changed from the softer carbon steel of years past to High Speed Steel and beyond. Sharpening has slowly migrated from Aluminum Oxide stone wheels to CBN wheels using slow speed motors. Lathes have changed from step pulleys to electronic speed controls with soft starts, all designed to keep you safer and more efficient in your woodturning journey. One tip all beginners need is not to buy a set of woodturning tools. They typically contain smaller, less usable length tools and includes some tools you will probably never use. It is less expensive to purchase the individual tools you need. If you have questions and would like to find out more about tools, equipment or the kinds of woodturning beginners should do, feel free to give a call. If I cannot help, I will connect you with someone who can.

ZOOM MEETING TROUBLESHOOTING

To connect to the meeting, all that is required is for you to click on a link provided below. This should launch your web browser to connect to the Zoom conferencing web site, and then follow any start-up instructions requested (you may need to answer 'Yes' to downloading the Zoom ".exe" file and start the program by clicking in your downloads list at the top of your browser's screen. If prompted to do so, click on "Join meeting with Video" and/or "Join meeting with Audio".

After a few seconds, you should see a screen with multiple boxes of member's video feeds. At the beginning of the meeting, we will go over how to control your microphone (mute or unmute), your video/camera feed, and other controls.

IF YOU ENCOUNTER PROBLEMS - contact **Tom Baker** for help with getting the connection problem resolved. Call 515-249-7503(cell).

In your "Settings" menu, it may be necessary to check to see that your webcam is turned on, that your microphone is turned on, and that the speakers are enabled.
