PREVIEW OF DEMONSTRATION PROGRAM





Will Zitterich makes large bowls, platters, and vessels up to 24 inches in diameter. He will show you how he mounts large wood blanks on the lathe and turns them. He will show some of the equipment and tools needed when turning large pieces of wood. The presentation will include a number of safety tips and procedures to make the turning safer. He will mount a number of different pieces of wood on the lathe, turn a tenon on one end, and demonstrate how the tenon is removed on the finished piece. Some of the steps in turning larger pieces are very similar to turning smaller pieces, but there are some steps that are not similar to turning smaller items. He will also give you the reasons why he takes these steps in turning.

WOODTURNING TRAINING CENTER NEWS

Each year our chapter conducts two entry level classes for members. The <u>Basic Woodturning</u> class is a two-day class that spans a period of a week. This class is required before members are eligible for any other classes taught. The second standard class is <u>Basic Bowl Turning</u> which covers turning cross grain rather than spindle turning. Anyone interested in taking either of these introductory classes should contact Dick Meuler by e-mail ASAP at <u>dmeuler@gmail.com</u>. Schedules will start to be filled yet this month for October and November classes.

Member class fees are a modest \$15/day. If enough people show an interest, we're also open to holding additional half or full day classes on special interest subjects such as tool sharpening, basic project texturing and embellishing, to mention just a few. Let me hear what specialty topics interest you. If you have questions, e-mail or call me at **515-991-8111 between 10a & 9p.** Leave a message if you catch me in a meeting.

We typically run these basic classes in the Spring and Fall each year. As you can imagine, Covid-19 has been a challenge to work through. With cases spiking again, we'll just have to watch the trends in our area. From a safety standpoint, I believe it will be necessary to have instructors and students come prepared to wear your face masks when you enter the training center. If 100% of attendees feel comfortable not wearing them once they see the room layout, or to waive them while safety face shields are being worn, we can relax those rules as a group.

NEW FREE LEARNING OPPORTUNITY FOR BEGINNERS – If Covid cooperates, we'd like to have an orientation day where new, inexperienced members, can come and learn about the various lathe options and capabilities before they purchase a new or used lathe. Same will go for lathe tools, sharpening systems, lathe accessories and personal protection equipment. No promises, but we'd like to find a day later this month to do this at our training center. There are parking restrictions so we may only be able to handle 4 to 6 members per session. But if demand is there, we could schedule both a morning and afternoon session to handle more. There will be time allocated for you to get your questions answered. Those attending should bring all lathe tools they own to have them evaluated for safety purposes and find out which sharpening wheels would work best for those tools. Getting set-up for woodturning will be far less expensive if you buy properly the first time. One piece of advice to remember, **DO NOT BUY NEW OR USED TOOL SETS**. Also, family heirloom tools are antiques and are not usually comparable to tool steel and tool design of this century.

CALL FOR VOLUNTEERS

We are an all-volunteer organization. Our success is due in large measure to the willingness of our volunteers. Whatever gets done, happens because someone volunteered. Some our on-going volunteers are stepping back and we therefore need replacements. We need volunteers to join the board of directors as well as take over the audio-visual duties for club meetings, and newsletter editor. There are also temporary / one off needs. ZOOM MEETING TROUBLESHOOTING

To connect to the meeting, all that is required is for you to click on a link provided below. This should launch your web browser to connect to the Zoom conferencing web site, and then follow any start-up instructions requested (you may need to answer 'Yes' to downloading the Zoom ".exe" file and start the program by clicking in your downloads list at the top of your browser's screen. If prompted to do so, click on "Join meeting with Video" and/or "Join meeting with Audio".

After a few seconds, you should see a screen with multiple boxes of member's video feeds. At the beginning of the meeting, we will go over how to control your microphone (mute or unmute), your video/camera feed, and other controls.

IF YOU ENCOUNTER PROBLEMS - contact **Tom Baker** for help with getting the connection problem resolved. Call 515-249-7503(cell).

In your "Settings" menu, it may be necessary to check to see that your webcam is turned on, that your microphone is turned on, and that the speakers are enabled.
