JANUARY CHAPTER MEETING

Basic Woodturning class covers safety and a host of woodturning basic info, plus demo/practice lessons using three basic tools to create most common shapes. Then on to turning an egg, a Christmas tree ornament, and a lidded box, all in spindle orientation. Class includes two days of training scheduled a week apart, so you have time to do assigned practice homework. That requires all students to own or have easy access to a wood lathe between class dates, to turn practice pieces that you are to bring to 2nd day of class. Students are responsible for furnishing 18 pieces of home practice wood that can be as simple as pine/fir 2 x 2 stock (1.5" x 1.5" x 8" long). In class, we'll furnish the needed turning tools and classroom use wood blanks, but you furnish the accessories (outside caliper, awl, center finder, 6" rule, ANSI Z87 face shield, and four jaw chuck w/#2 jaws if you have one). This class is a required prerequisite to take any other classes our Chapter training group conducts. Total cost for both days is \$40 cash or check, exact amount please.

NOTE: When purchasing tools for home use, refrain from buying tool sets. They are often smaller tools, they contain a tool or two you might use, but not others considered as basic tools. Buy only full size, <u>M2 HSS</u> or stronger treated steel, individual tools you know you need. It's the least expensive way to go. HSS steel rating alone is typically a cheap Asian made tool and doesn't hold a sharp edge well. Students new to woodturning should also own, or be prepared to invest in, a sharpening system since tool sharpening is required frequently to make woodturning safe, fun, and advance your skills. This class utilizes traditional turning tools and does NOT cover using carbide tools.

Basic Bowl Turning (cross grain) class touches on basics of wood harvesting, differences from spindle turning, introduces the bowl gouge and practice turning before moving on to turning a Hard Maple bowl. One full day of class, we supply the tools, you provide the accessories and PPE, same as in Basic Woodturning class. All class wood provided. Cost \$20 cash or check, exact amount please.

<u>Basic Segmenting</u> class will cover the basics of making segmented projects from calculating segment angles and sizes, ring diameters needed, segment wood prep, gluing and clamping, to accurate cutting fixtures. You'll glue together furnished pre-cut segments and clamp them. Turning will be demonstrated but students won't be using the lathe in class. Class segments for glue-up practice will be furnished. Bring paper and pen/pencil to take notes. One day class, cost \$20 cash or check, exact amount please.

<u>Basic Skew Chisel</u> class will introduce students to the proper techniques and use of the tool as well as sharpening. Students to furnish their own skew chisel(s) (3/4"-up preferred) and same accessories and PPE as Basic Woodturning class. Class wood provided. One day class, cost \$20 cash or check, exact amount please.
