THE BEDAN TOOL - How and Why I use it - By Dick Meuler

The Bedan was popularized by well-known French woodturner Jean-Francois Escoulen and is accurately described as a French Bedan due to its' shape and longer bevel. It is unique in that it has three cutting edges, which I'll demonstrate on Saturday. I'll use it to rough a square spindle to round, form straight and dovetail tenons, remove excess material while forming a spindle project shape, use it as a skew to make slicing cuts, use it bevel up and bevel down, create a bead, and hollow end grain to make a small goblet. That's a lot to ask of a tool whos' cost is closer to that of a 3/8" spindle gouge than a 3/8" bowl gouge. And best yet, it's easy to sharpen.....kind of.
