EDUCATIONAL PROGRAM

April will be the second month of our new educational program format. We plan to have three shorter educational topics each month. Hopefully the diversity of topics and presenters will be beneficial. I welcome your feedback on both the format and the topics.



OFFSET CHRISTMAS TREE

Stan Merrell is going to demonstrate his technique for making offset Christmas trees (examples show in the photo at the left). Offset turning can be exciting, since you are cutting a lot of air, some of the time.





CUTTING SEGMENTS

Bill Burchett is going to lead a discussion on techniques, tips, tricks, tool, and jigs for cutting segments. Bill will be joined by other chapter members with expertise in segmenting.



HANDLES

Jim Reynolds will share his process for making a couple of different handles. The first will be making a wooden handle for a five-gallon bucket. This project uses the paper glue joint technique. The second project is replacing the plastic handle of a six-way screwdriver with a wooden handle. Jim will also bring in some other handles he has made.

WOODTURNING "SCRAP" WOOD CHALLENGE

We want to engage you in turning activities and exercise your creativity and imagination and then have you share the experience with the rest of the chapter. As the subject indicates, we would like to see what you have done or can do with those pieces of wood we call scrap wood, crap wood, firewood, or cutoffs.
