ITEMS NEEDED FOR THE IOWA STATE FAIR

by Tom Whalley Our booth at the fair is the single largest source of revenue for our club. We rely on volunteers to make all the items for sale at the booth. Please consider how you can contribute to this effort. We frequently talk about making spurtles, rolling pins and Christmas trees; however, those are items we actually make at the fair by way of the demonstrations we do for the public to watch. When we get low on those items, the demonstrator(s) start cranking them out. Last year we had two lathes going to keep up the demand for rolling pins. What we can't do at the fair is made items like bowls, lidded boxes – things that take a lot more time, require a fine sanding job and finishing. These items are what we need our members to concentrate on between now and the Saturday before the fair when we set up our booth. Naturally, we will gladly receive your spurtles, Christmas trees, rolling pins, etc., but we really need the items we can't turn at the fair. We have turning blanks available at the scout center (next month's meeting will be Wednesday, June 29th due to a conflict at the scout center). If you need some in the meantime, let me or any board member know, and we can make arrangements for you to get them. Many people use stock they already have. Inventory on these items is really low with not much time left before the fair starts. This group of items represents our largest revenue generating sector and is the best way we can show what our members can do. We get many, many comments about your craftsmanship! Bring your finished items to the scout center (we only have June and July left before the fair starts), or you can drop them off at Tom Whalley's home in Urbandale. Call first to be sure he is there. This is also a great way to hone your skills to become an even better turner than you are. If you have any questions, any board member or Tom would be glad to provide guidance and information.

I would encourage any of you that have not taken a basic woodturning hands-on workshop, to sign-up for the 2-day Basic Woodturning class. It is hands on with lots of personal attention for each student. REMEMBER, students must attend the 2-day Basic Woodturning class as a prerequisite to take any other Chapter offered training class.

We furnish the turning tools for you to use in the Basic Woodturning and Basic Bowl Turning classes. All but one of the Fall training classes have openings. Eleven (over one third) of the 32 slots have already been reserved and one of the eight classes is now full. Each class will be offered twice as shown below. All classes are held in the Valley Junction area of West Des Moines. We reserve the right to cancel or postpone any class with too few registrants. Now would be a good time to get your name in to attend classes.
