NOVEMBER CHAPTER MEETING

Our next monthly meeting will be Saturday, November 12th, 2022, at 1:00 PM, at the Woodsmith Store in Clive. Please remember to park well away from the entrance (North row or far East side of the lot) of the store to allow other customer access during the meeting. We will have a quick business meeting, voting for 2023 officers, and giving the rest of the meeting time to our guest presenter Keith Lackner.

Keith Lackner is a world renowned and leading artist in Resin Infusions. He began wood turning in 2012 with the idea of creating a different concept for the woodturning world. He enjoys working with highly figured burls and infusing them with casting resins.

Keith will be teaching us the fine points of resin casting. He will begin with taking a piece of burl wood that would have normally been discarded due to it being structurally unsafe, or just not enough wood to make a beautiful vase. He will go through the (3-P'S) of getting ready for the lathe. After he has completed a live demonstrated cast, he will move to the lathe where he will show us the techniques he has developed over the years to create a one-of-a-kind piece of art.

OCTOBER MEETING MINUTES

-Tom Whalley opened the meeting with a welcome and asked some of the guests about their hometown and woodturning interests and skills. Tom declined to have a math minute but maybe next month. -Bill Burchett, program committee would like someone to volunteer to help get program topics for future meetings. A volunteer to help Bill put together the program is needed since we have gone to three topics or demonstrations at each monthly meeting. This makes it more interesting to members at the meeting but more work for the program committee.

-Dick Meuler, Training Coordinator, listed the openings available for the Basic Segmenting Class, Basic Bowl Turning Class, and the Basic Skew Turning Class.

-Tom introduced the slate of officers for next year. Election of officers will be at the November monthly meeting. They are: President, Tom Whalley; Vice President, open; Secretary, Will Zitterich; Treasurer, Stan Merrell; Education, Tad Tadlock; Membership, Dan Carlson; Programs, Bill Burchett; At large, John Amberg. -The next networking event will be at the Scout Center on November 16th. which is the 3rd Wednesday of the month.

- Program Topics:

Tom Whalley talked about state fair items and a French rolling pin, He thought the quality of bowls members made for the state fair this year was great. He outlined the new drawings on the club website for spurtles, rolling pins, dibbles, and Christmas trees. He showed examples of sample spurtles and discussed how now we are making a French rolling pin which has more of a curved surface. Our previous drawings showed a straight surface. Tom explained a new process for getting wood from the club to make fair items. Members will be asked to sign out the pieces of wood they will use to make fair projects and sign them back in when the item is finished.

-Daniel Henderson made a presentation about turning plates. He made a jig for gluing up various pieces of wood to make blank for a plate or platter. He explained how he rearranges the wood pieces until he is

satisfied how the rough blank appears. He is mixing a number of different kinds and colors of wood as well as the sizes of them. He is not only making a plate that can be used but he is making a work of art. -Bill Burchett demonstrated how he make a Christmas tree ornament. He begins with a cube of wood about 2 inches square. The cube will be the main part or base of the ornament. He drills a small hole in opposing sides of the cube which will be the future connections of the top finial and the other for the bottom finial. He then drilled a large hole with a Forstner bit a little smaller that the cube dimensions on each of the four sides but not on the top or bottom of the cube. This leaves a large space in the cube for Bill to include small turned items inside the cube. The ornament will then be a hollow cube with a top finial and a bottom finial as the finished ornament.

MAKING A FRENCH ROLLING PIN

I mentioned at the October Chapter meeting one of the main reasons we ask members of our Chapter to make items to sell at the Iowa State Fair is to improve their turning skills. These items represent different facets of skill building that hopefully you will find valuable in your woodturning journey. The new French rolling pin will add one more skill – creating a long and uniform arch in a spindle.


In the past, our "French" rolling pins consisted of a cylinder with tapered ends. The diameter of the cylinder was frequently too big. After researching just what a French rolling pin actually is, and how it is made, we have changed the design and the way these are to be created. For the 2023 Iowa State Fair, we will be offering our new design of French rolling pins in three lengths – 12", 18" and 24". The actual dimensions of the blank, midpoint diameters, and end dimensions are shown on the French rolling pin drawings on the website along with a drawing showing the arc for making the sanding block at: (https://www.dmwoodturners.com/wp-content/uploads/2022/10/Rolling-pin-detail-2022-10-9.pdf). The most critical part of these rolling pins is a continuous and uniform curve from one end to the other. In the past, we focused on a straight line. This time, we are after a continuous curve.

At the October meeting, I demonstrated how to actually make one. In the event you missed that demo, or would like a "refresher" on how it is done, I have created a step-by-step method of making these below. I have highlighted in red the areas of wood that will be removed within each step. The techniques are the same for all three sizes.

Blanks for the French rolling pins (as well as all sizes of the spurtle blanks) will be in available in the back of my red truck at the end of upcoming Chapter meetings (in the back of my red truck) as well as inside at our monthly Scout Center networking meetings. There will be a sheet for you to print your name and indicate how many of what size rolling pin blanks and/or spurtle blanks you are taking. Remember, since we had such a successful year of selling rolling pins and spurtles last year, we are asking members to make a lot of these, so please help us out. Thank you and turn safe.
