DECEMBER CHAPTER MEETING

Our next monthly meeting will be Saturday, December 10th, 2022, at 1:00 PM, at the Woodsmith Store in Clive. Please remember to park well away from the entrance (North row or far East side of the lot) of the store to allow other customer access during the meeting.

Presenters: Mike Hamilton will be presenting turning a Potpourri bowl for the group.

Will Zitterich has been turning since he retired in 2010. He has turned items large and small. Most of the pieces he turns are green wood and have recently come from a tree that has recently been cut down. The pieces are turned green and then stored in a green room or drying room for about 1 year. They are then ready to be remounted on the lathe, re-turned, and then finished.

Wood bowls that have been drying for 1 year do exhibit some wood movement. Some woods are very stable during the drying process but some woods distort significantly or have developed some cracking. There is not just one way to re-mount a warped or distorted bowl. He will show many ways to re-mount a bowl after the drying process, re-turn it, and turn it safely. Members are invited to bring a piece that they are questioning or are unsure how to re-mount the bowl.

You might also notice we have had 5 or more drawings of usable turning items at the Scout Center. I think you will see that again in December. There will be turning kits of all kinds (especially for you pen turners), a laser guide for hollowing, a press never out of the box, never used air brushes and an off-center jig system never out of the box. All of these and many more items have been donated by one of our members.

NOVEMBER MEETING MINUTES

Tom Whalley called the meeting to order and began with the process of electing next year's Board of Directors. This will be for a one-year term beginning on Jan 1 2023 and ending on Dec 31, 2023.

Dick Meuler conducted the election of officers since Tom Whalley is on the ballot for President of the Des Moines Woodturners club. Dick Mueler asked if there was a motion from the floor to unanimously accept the slate as presented. There was a motion and second from the floor to accept the slate of officers as presented and it was unanimously accepted by a clear majority of the membership present.

The officers elected to the Board of Directors for 2023 are: President, Tom Whalley; Vice President, open; Secretary, Will Zitterich; Treasurer, Stan Merrell; Education, Tat Tadlock; Membership, Dan Carlson; Programs, Bill Burchett; and Director at large, John Amberg.

There was a motion from the floor to conclude and adjourn the annual business meeting. It was seconded and the motion was approved. Tom Whalley then closed the 2022 annual business meeting.

Keith Lackner was the featured demonstrator. He is a world renowned and leading artist in resin infusions. He began turning in 2012 with the idea of creating a different concept for the woodturning world. While turning one day he came up with the idea of mixing urethane resins and highly figured burls to create one of a kind piece. He works with highly figured burls and infuses them with casting resins. He demonstrated or describes some of the techniques he has developed over the years.

He began by showing how to cast resins in a casting form. He showed how a turner can make a form out of plastic, foam, or other material that will hold the resin without leaking out of the form. He uses forms to cast pen blanks and his one-of-a-kind snowmen.

Keith begins with a burl that may be very deteriorated and full of cracks and even large parts missing in the burl piece. The burl may be unsound and cannot be turned safely. By adding a resin to the burl, the resin fills in the cracks and voids. But the resin will not be infused into the burl without the aid of a pressure pot to force the resin into all the voids and cracks and fissures.

Keith explained the process to mix part A and part B in the correct proportions. The measurement of each part can be by volume or weight. Mixing the proportions together is very important and he uses a digital scale to make sure the mixture is mixed in the correct proportions. He explained some of the choices a turner has in buying resins. The mixing times before setting begins is not the same for all resins, but the time is limited as it may be less than 8-10 minutes. He also explained various coloring agents that can be used to add color to the clear resins.

Keith explained some of the options a turner has for buying a pressure pot. Pressure pots must be certified to safely maintain the desired pressure. Small ones less than a gallon may cost a few hundreds of dollars to many thousands of dollars for larger one. He lets the resins curing for about 24 hours.

Keith demonstrated turning the piece with carbide tools as resins are very hard. He also stressed that the tools must be kept sharp for good results. To get glossy finishes begins by using sanding grits beginning with about 220 and incrementally all the way to 12000 grits. He uses several different finishes on the resins including automobile finishes.

Keith included many aspects of using resins during his 3-hour presentation. After the presentation members were able to talk to him and see some of his finished pieces.
