# MARCH CHAPTER MEETING

Our next monthly meeting will be Saturday, March 11<sup>th</sup>, 2023, at 1:00 PM, at the Woodsmith Store in Clive. Please remember to park well away from the entrance (North row or far East side of the lot) for customer access during the meeting. Our presenters for the month will be Dick Meuler and Dave Yearian.



Member Dick Meuler (Moy Ler) will demonstrate turning and finishing of a Spurtle and a Dibble (or Dibbler) at our Saturday, March 11th meeting at The Woodsmith Store. These are two simple spindle projects that any woodturner can make. Dick will share the techniques and methods he uses to turn each, PLUS, his personalized style that sets them apart for a practical reason. In addition, he'll share his version of "Scottish Spurtle history" told to visitors, who hopefully become customers at our lowa State Fair booth in August. That's where we sell a host of member turned items during the fair each year. In our monthly Chapter demos, we are trying to demonstrate several of those items to emphasize the importance of quality and attention to needed product details.

Newer members may not know that Dick has worked with wood since his teenage years, nearly 70 years ago. He joined the Des Moines Woodworkers in 1995 and served on their board for approximately six years and again in 2010. He took the Basic Woodturning class in February of 2009 with a new Jet 1220 VS lathe and added a used Powermatic 3520B in 2014. He has been a part of the training team since 2013 when the Chapter separated from the Des Moines Woodworkers due to new insurance requirements. He was instrumental in acquiring a 501(c)(3) Non-Profit status with the IRS and incorporating the new non-profit DM Woodturners Inc. with the State of Iowa. He has remained as the organization's Registered Agent. He has since served in leadership roles as Membership chair, Newsletter Editor, VP 2013-2014, President 2015, 2016, 2017, and undertook coordinating training classes in 2020, 2021, and 2022. He continues as one of the training instructors in 2023. He enjoys turning utility items that are functional and purposeful and is said to enjoy production turning, within reason. Favorite turning woods are hard Maple, Cherry, Walnut, and Osage Orange when he can find it. In 2022, his hands, or projects he was turning, were pictured 39 times in three issues of WOOD magazine, including two issues with projects of his own design. Those photos verified he still has eight fingers and two thumbs, albeit some have telltale woodworking scars.

Dave Yearian is an active member of the Des Moines Woodturners Association and is a very experienced woodturner. Dave has assisted in our training process and plays an important part in making the State Fair booth successful. He will be explaining how the "simple pens" are made and he will provide examples of various designs. Dave will undertake the first step of drilling all the blanks (300 to 400 blanks) which allows the membership to complete the design using their own creativity. The "simple pens" are very popular and generates good revenue for our association. We struggle to get volunteers to complete the final steps and would encourage everyone to join in the fun.

Thanks to all those who have signed up for classes. Further details and instructions will be sent by email two to three weeks before the first class date. We need additional students for the unfilled classes. A minimum enrollment of 3 students per class is required. Each class will improve your skill and confidence as a turner. In addition, you have the opportunity to get to know a few of your fellow turners and we always have a few laughs. We are looking forward to helping you become a safe and confident woodturner.

The two-day Basic Woodturning class is held for two consecutive Mondays. Attendance on both dates, along with turning in assigned homework done in your shop between class dates, is a requirement to be eligible to take other scheduled Training Center classes. Classes run from 8:30am - 5:00pm with a 30-minute lunch break.

To complete assigned class homework, students must own a lathe, or have ready access to one. The turning tools are provided but some measuring and safety accessories are required. All other classes are one day only. Tools are also provided for the Bowl Class. No turning tools are required for the Basic Segmenting class but the Basic Skew chisel class requires students to bring their own skew chisel(s).

Members are encouraged to only purchase individual tools you know you need and made from M2 or harder steel such as M4, M42, CPM 10V, A11 and others. In the current marketplace, HSS markings alone no longer designates adequate tool steel quality. Above all, refrain from purchasing tool sets. They tend to contain scaled down size tools (shorter life) and tools you'll likely never use while missing others you'll soon want in your tool rack.

A fall class schedule will also be available starting September 18 and finishing November 20. If you have suggestions for additional class subjects or have other questions, please contact me.

Class fees remain the same at \$20 per class day.
