

### **December 9th Chapter Meeting**

### A TwoFer Fun Project Demo with Tips



Member Dick Meuler (Moy Ler) will be demonstrating two projects that can be done by any skill level that understands the proper and safe use of basic spindle and bowl gouges plus parting tools that are all properly shaped and sharpened. He'll even turn a little air during the first demo.

Proper, safe, and sharp will be talked about along the way of both demonstrations.

The first will be a small cross-grain natural rimmed form commonly referred to as a Bird's Mouth Bowl. It is made from a 3" diameter by 4" long barked straight branch stock preferably, but trunk stock from small trees can also work. It can be done on a midi or full size lathe. He'll start between centers as illustrated, but finish in a scroll chuck. You'll learn how to quickly and easily, with no math involved, find the centers on each side of the log section. He'll also use a drill bit in a Jacobs chuck in the tail stock. You just might learn things you can apply to other unrelated projects as well. Tools needed: 3/8" (1/2" shaft) Bowl Gouge, 3/8" or 1/2" Spindle Gouge, Parting tool, Jacobs Chuck with #2 MT and drill bit.

See photo illustrating how to start by mounting turning blank between centers, along with two completed projects sitting on the lathe bed. Gives a whole new perspective to "cross-grain" turning!



Time permitting, the second demo will be a simple spindle oriented ornament mounted between centers. It can be made from inexpensive construction lumber cutoffs, even if they have nail holes, blemishes or dents in them, as long as they are safe to turn, or any hardwood as well. The same process taught can be used for many other projects, providing you plan to ....... (come to meeting to find out the rest of the story). Tools needed: Spindle Roughing Gouge, 3/8" or 1/2" Spindle Gouge and Parting tool. See ornament photo.

**BIO**: Dick is a USAF 4 year veteran and married just 10 days prior to reporting for basic training. He and his wife Pat (of 60+ yrs) have two senior citizen children, two grandchildren and two great-grandchildren aged 10 and 14. He has been building things with wood for nearly 70 years. After his first retirement in the mid-90's, he attended a half dozen classes at the Marc Adams School of Woodworking in Indiana. In 1995 he joined the Des Moines Woodworkers Association and served as newsletter editor, treasurer, database manager, and webmaster and remains a member today. He also worked part time as a free lance contractor at WOOD magazine for a dozen years until 2014 and again recently as a woodturner for woodturning articles in the magazine. In 2009, following medical surgery, he converted from flat work and took the last Basic Woodturning class taught by Chuck Dowler, who

developed the first training classes for the Chapter in 2005. At the time, classes ran for one day a week for five to six weeks. Having acquired the Chapter 501(c)(3) status from the IRS in 2014, Dick is the Registered Agent for the corporate entity and has served as the newsletter editor, VP (2013/14), and President (2015/16/17) of our Chapter. He continues to serve as a member of our Training Team at our Woodturning Training Center at the Chuck Haas provided facility in West Des Moines.

### **Taxes and Giving**

Effective January 7, 2014 the Internal Revenue Service determined Des Moines Woodturners Inc. is exempt from federal income tax under Internal Revenue Code (IRC) Section 501(c)(3). Donors may be able to deduct contributions they make under IRC Section 170. The organization is further qualified to receive tax deductible bequests, devices, transfers or gifts under Section 2055, 2106, or 2522. Be sure to ask your tax advisor if your deduction would qualify.

How to receive tax-deductions for your charitable donations: The charitable donation deduction allows you to lower your taxable income for donations or gifts to qualified, tax-exempt organizations. To get the deduction, you must itemize on <a href="Form 1040">Form 1040</a>, Schedule A. Gifts of equipment, tools, accessories, books, videos, etc. will be deductible only if the items are in "good used condition or better."

**Volunteering Deductions:** Although you can't deduct the value of time or services donated to an organization, you can deduct any costs that are incurred during volunteering, such as gas mileage or the cost of a volunteer uniform.

Cash, Check or other Monetary Gift Donation: For these contributions (regardless of amount), you must maintain a record of the contribution. A bank record or written communication from the qualified organization containing the name of the organization, the amount, and the date of the contribution.

Property Donation: You can deduct the fair market value of property you donate to qualified organizations. See <u>Publication 561</u>, Determining the Value of Donated Property.

**Please consider DMWT in your estate and tax planning.** Your donations to Des Moines Woodturners Inc., a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization, may be eligible for a tax deduction, but always check with your tax advisor.

### **Spring 2024 Classes Are Available For Enrollment**

**Basic Woodturning:** If you have not taken Basic Woodturning you will find it useful if you're new to turning, been away from the lathe for awhile or would just like a refresher. Enhance your spindle turning skills. It is a fun day and a confidence builder. In addition, it is the prerequisite for the other courses. Basic Woodturning is two consecutive Mondays, 8:30 to 5 and costs \$40.

**Basic Bowl Turning:** This class touches on basics of wood harvesting, differences from spindle turning, and introduces the bowl gouge. You will practice on a poplar blank before turning your Hard Maple bowl. The class is one full day. We provide the tools and blanks, you provide the accessories and face shield. This is a one day class and costs \$20.

**Basic Segmenting:** This class will cover the basics of making segmented projects, from calculating segment angles and sizes, ring diameters needed, segment wood prep, gluing and clamping, to accurate cutting fixtures. You'll glue together furnished pre-cut segments and clamp them. Turning will be demonstrated but students won't be using the lathe in the class. Pre-cut segments for glue-up practice will be furnished. Bring paper and pencil to take notes. This is a one day class and costs \$20.

**Basic Skew Chisel:** This class will introduce students to the proper techniques and use of the tool as well as sharpening. Students will furnish their own skew chisel(s) (3/4 inch and up preferred). We will use the same accessories as in the Basic Woodturning Class. This is a one day class and costs \$20.

**Basic Sharpening:** The sharpening class will use lathe mounted sandpaper sharpening wheels and wooden dowels to teach the techniques of sharpening. This class is primarily for gouges but will also touch on a variety of other common traditional turning tools such as parting tools, skew, bedan and scrapers. In addition, sharpening hollowing tools, thread chasers, hook tools

and common flat carbide cutters will be discussed. After practice, students will have the opportunity to sharpen their own tools using the Oneway Wolverine Sharpening system and CBN wheels. This is a one day class and costs \$20.
