February 8th Demonstration Daniel Henderson Turning an Oval

The object of turning is to end up with an object in a round or cylindrical shape; be it a bowl, plate or platter, spurtle. For our February presentation Daniel is going to show you how to layout and turn (on purpose) an oval. It isn't a complicated procedure, but there are a few things one must be aware of to get a good result. This is a technique that will get you a lot of "how did you do that?" guestions.

As time permits he will also demonstrate how to use this technique in a decorative manner to enhance a turning.

Daniel Henderson first started turning in college in 1973, as part of his Industrial Education curriculum at the University of Idaho. Over



the next 20 years his turning was intermittent, but has been constant since his retirement in 2010. He enjoys segmented turning and creating enhancements in the pieces he turns. Lately his focus is turning glued up plates and platters, with an occasional fishing lure thrown in for fun. You will also find him in his sketch book, which he relies on for percolating ideas and patterns. "Here is where the fun begins and nothing is off limits. I have books as far back as the 1990's, and still use some of the ideas for new turnings. Turning is the greatest expression of creativity I know. Taking a gnarly piece of wood and ending with a beautiful form is a fantastic feeling."



March 8th Demonstration Logan Wittmer Metal Turning on the Lathe

Our standard turning tools work really well for turning all sort of metals. We'll cover turning brass, aluminum, and smelting and turning pewter as accents to wood turning.

Logan Wittmer is the editor-in-chief of Popular Woodworking Magazine, located in Des Moines, and a cast member of the PBS television show the Woodsmith Shop. Not only is woodworking and woodturning his daily duties, but they're also his passion. In his free time, Logan is often found in his shop standing at one of his lathes, or out in his log yard, running native Iowa hardwoods through his Logosol Bandsaw mill.

Summary Glen Farmer Demonstration January 11, 2025

Before joining the Des Moines Wood Turners club, Glen taught wood turning in California. One of the techniques he taught was finishing the bottom of bowls. There are different ways to finish the bottom of a bowl, and he demonstrated 4 different ways during his demonstration. Glen demonstrated holding the bowl for turning using a jamb chuck. The jamb chuck is put on the headstock and is placed in the top of the bowl. The bottom of the bowl is centered on the tail stock center. This gave Glen enough room at the bottom of the bowl to finish or enhance the bottom of the bowl. If using the jamb chuck did not give you enough room to finish the bottom at the tailstock end, Glen demonstrated another type of jamb chuck. He made a jamb chuck to fit tightly inside the top edge of the bowl. If the jamb chuck is made to fit tightly inside the edge of the bowl, the tail stock can be removed giving total access to the bottom of the bowl without the tailstock being in the way. He also put tape around the edge attached to bowl to make it a little unlikely that the bowl will come off when finishing the bowl bottom. Glen also demonstrated making a glue block to be attached to the bottom of the bowl. Using



a glue block centered on the tailstock gives the turner more room to finish bowl bottom as it keeps the tailstock center farther away from the bowl bottom. Glen demonstrated several different ways to enhance the bowl bottom using beads, coves, ridges. Glen used a vacuum chuck to demonstrate another way to finish the bottom of a bowl. He made his vacuum apparatus from reclaimed equipment and used a section of PVC pipe for the chuck. It did not make a lot of vacuum but was enough to hold a small bowl. It can be difficult to get the bowl centered on the vacuum chuck, but the easiest way is to use the tailstock to center the bowl on the vacuum chuck. Using a vacuum check allows the turner to remove the tail stock to make the bowl bottom more accessible to enhance the bottom of the bowl. His demonstration gave turners several ways to hold the bowls. The shape of the bowl will determine which way would work best for the turner to finish the bottom of the bowl. His demonstration gave turners more options that they can be use when finishing the bottom of a bowl.








Training News

2025 Woodturning Classes

General Information: You will receive an information packet by email approximately 1 month before the class. It contains a list of required accessories, location and safety information. A reminder will arrive about 1 week before the class. The fee is collected on the day of the class. There is no penalty for cancellation, but please let us know ASAP if you have to cancel.

Basic Woodturning: If you have not taken Basic Woodturning you will find it useful if you're new to turning, been away from the lathe for awhile or would just like a refresher. Enhance your spindle turning skills. It is a fun day and a confidence builder. In addition, it is the prerequisite for the other courses. DWMT provides the tools and wood. Homework is assigned between classes so you will need access to a lathe. Basic Woodturning is two consecutive Mondays, 8:30 to 5. Cost: \$40.

Basic Bowl Turning: This class touches on basics of wood harvesting, differences from spindle turning, and introduces the bowl gouge. You will practice on a Poplar blank before turning your Hard Maple bowl. The class is one full day. DMWT provides the tools and blanks, you provide the accessories and face shield. This is a one day class. Cost: \$20.

Basic Segmenting: This class will cover the basics of making segmented projects, from calculating segment angles and sizes, ring diameters needed, segment wood prep, gluing and clamping, to accurate cutting fixtures. You'll glue together furnished pre-cut segments and clamp them. Turning will be demonstrated but students won't be using the lathe in the class. Pre-cut segments for glue-up practice will be furnished. Bring paper and pencil to take notes. This is a one day class. Cost: \$20.

Basic Skew Chisel: This class will introduce students to the proper techniques and use of the tool as well as sharpening. Students will furnish their own skew chisel(s) (3/4 inch and up preferred). We will use the same accessories as in the Basic Woodturning Class. This is a one day class. Cost: \$20.

Basic Sharpening: The sharpening class will use lathe mounted sandpaper sharpening wheels and wooden dowels to teach the techniques of sharpening. This class is primarily for gouges but will also touch on a variety of other common traditional turning tools such as parting tools, skew, bedan and scrapers. In addition, sharpening hollowing tools, thread chasers, hook tools and common flat carbide cutters will be discussed. After practice, students will have the opportunity to sharpen their own tools using the Oneway Wolverine Sharpening system and CBN wheels. This is a one day class. Cost: \$20.

DMWT Woodturning Scholarship

The Des Moines Woodturners offer a scholarship program for the benefit of chapter members. Woodturning can be an expensive endeavor. The cost of equipment such as a lathe, bandsaw, chainsaw, sharpening system, buffing system and the myriad of items like drive centers, scroll chucks, live centers, adapters, jaws, and faceplates can mount rapidly. In addition is the cost of turning tools, embellishing tools, specialty tools and a host of accessories, supplies and finishing products, not to mention the cost of wood if you don't have the capacity to harvest your own.

By the same token, three and five day woodturning educational events are also expensive when located out-of-state. Travel costs, lodging and tuition can easily run \$1,000 to \$1,700 per event.

This scholarship is not intended as a source of financial aid for those who might otherwise not be able to afford the educational experience. Instead, it is offered as an incentive to those serious about woodturning who are willing to expand their skills and knowledge and bring those skill-sets back to share with our members in a variety of ways. The scholarship can provide recipients a 25% to 50% discount toward the overall cost of their attendance expenses.

The purpose of the scholarship is to expand personal woodturning skills and knowledge and share their experience with fellow members by:

- -Attending Chapter events and sharing their learning experience.
- -Showing examples of their work as a result of their learning experience.
- -Demonstrating what they learned at a chapter meeting, event, or class.
- -Sharing their overall learning experience and confidence building experience.
- -Encouraging members to expand their woodturning skills via similar educational experiences.
- -Volunteering for Chapter leadership positions (wide variety of opportunities).
