May 10th Demonstration-Threading Chris Saleh, Roger Nass, Donna Byers




Donna Byers:

I started turning, probably in the 80's. Have for the most part, been self taught. I started with pens & made a few hundred. The largest bowl I have made was about 14". I mostly do small stuff & really like making boxes & ornaments. Many of the items go to the State Fair for our booth. I started out with a small Ryobi lathe & after a couple others, I now have a Laguna 18/36.



Chris Saleh:

Chris began his woodworking journey around age ten under the tutelage of his dad, a cabinet maker by trade and a hobby turner. Chris mainly focused on flatwork until he got his first lathe in 2020 and has been turning regularly since then. He started off making bowls and platters but has since gained an appreciation for spindle turning. Lately his interests have been centered around thread chasing and gaining proficiency with the skew chisel.



Roger Nass:

Upon retiring in 2003 I was looking for a hobby to occupy my spare time. At this same time we moved to Ames, Iowa, and selected a property with a house and an outbuilding which could serve as a shop. I acquired woodworking equipment and started to build Craftsman style furniture. I hosted an Ames Woodworking Club meeting on pen turning and got hooked on the world of woodturning.

After developing technical skills which allowed me to turn about any form I desired (bowls, platters, vases, hollow forms, etc.), I started to seek specific tree species and special areas within the tree that had interesting grain.

As a turner I frown upon painting or dying the turned piece. Instead, I want to expose the beauty of wood as it appears in the living tree.

I also turn objects that have a useful purpose as well as being nice to look at.

I started turning hollow forms, and to make them useful I put threaded closures on them. This led me on a journey of how to thread. I started with hand chasing and ended up with machine threading. This allows me to use any wood, including spalted wood, in any configuration (end or cross grain).






Chuck Maintenance Dick Meuler



Member Spotlight - Mark Hayes



We came across this chestnut oak tree with an odd stripe on our hike a couple days ago. After reaching out to friends at the forest service and the city arborist, here is what we learned.

The tree has a good lean to it. It most likely twisted and had a serious stress crack, so the tree compartmentalized the wound by growing a new layer of bark over it from both sides. That's why we see the seam down the middle.

This is called CODIT in the tree world. CODIT stands for Compartmentalization Of Decay In Trees, a model describing how trees respond to injury by forming barriers to contain decay and prevent its spread.

Summary of State Fair Turnings Demonstration April 12, 2025 Chapter Meeting

Club members **Duane Groenenboom** and **Mark Hayes** discussed State Fair turnings and demonstrated by turning trees and pens.

Mark turned a 1-inch diameter by about 8-inch round stock into a pen in which the club then inserts a BIC type ink cartridge. He mentioned these remain a very popular and "best deal at the fair" for buyers. Use of pin jaws in a chuck along with a tailstock support is recommended to hold the project. Mark used a Sorby beading tool to add three beads near the top of the pen and then used a thin Formica piece to burn the lines between the beads. A wire could be used to burn lines. Then using a spindle gouge, he formed a shape to fit a hand. He mentioned there are many designs including baseball bats and pens with a basketball on top that are popular.

Duane demonstrated turning a tree from red cedar. Preference is for 6 inch or taller trees. First, he formed the cone using a roughing gouge, then a tenon to mount to a chuck. He has used 3/8, 1/2, or 5/8 inches between the boughs of the tree, depending on the desired look. A thin parting tool was used to mark the boughs, then a spindle gouge to form each branch shape. A detail gouge was used to clean edges and form the topper. Then it was sanded with 220 grit sandpaper to remove tool marks. 400 grit sandpaper can be used for added finish. The topper had to be completed prior to forming the trunk so that it would maintain structural integrity when no tail stock support would be used. Then friction polish was added to complete the project.

Duane discussed turning and dying a tree with cactus juice. First complete rough turning, then use a toaster oven to remove moisture from the wood. Weighing the wood first, then toasting, then weigh again and complete the process until there is no reduction in weight at which point he assumed moisture is gone. Then soaked in cactus juice and put into a vacuum pot. Approximately 90 minutes for light coloration and up to 5 hours for a deep color. The project is then turned and completed the same as the tree he demonstrated on the lathe.

Mark demonstrated tree enhancements. First turn the tree to desired shape. Then add a coat of sanding sealer. A gouge can be used to cut decorative lines at the bough ridges. Then he used a Sorby texturing tool to add impressions in each bough. Next, he applied a colored Briwax coat to the tree boughs, followed by buffing with a towel and then buffing with a Scotch Brite white pad to buff (0000 steel wool could also be used). The deeper color remained in the Sorby ridges and the balance had a lighter color enhancement. A second tree enhancement by Mark used a shaped birch tree about 5-inch diameter and 10 inch height that did not have bough markings. The wood had been blackened with a torch, then 2-3 coats of sanding sealer. Mark then added a white Minwax highlighting wax liberally to the tree followed by buffing with a Scotch Brite pad to remove all white except what was retained in the depressions and markings on the tree. End result is a black tree shape with white accents throughout. He mentioned Behr antique glaze is an option to use in place of the Minwax highlighting wax. The entire presentation demonstrated ways to add accents to make each tree unique and appealing to the eye.


Volunteers Needed 2025 Iowa State Fair, August 7 to 17

Training News

2025 Woodturning Classes

General Information: You will receive an information packet by email approximately 1 month before the class. It contains a list of required accessories, location and safety information. A reminder will arrive about 1 week before the class. The fee is collected on the day of the class. There is no penalty for cancellation, but please let us know ASAP if you have to cancel.

Basic Woodturning: If you have not taken Basic Woodturning you will find it useful if you're new to turning, been away from the lathe for awhile or would just like a refresher. Enhance your spindle turning skills. It is a fun day and a confidence builder. In addition, it is the prerequisite for the other courses. DWMT provides the tools and wood. Homework is assigned between classes so you will need access to a lathe. Basic Woodturning is two consecutive Mondays, 8:30 to 5. Cost: \$40.

Basic Bowl Turning: This class touches on basics of wood harvesting, differences from spindle turning, and introduces the bowl gouge. You will practice on a Poplar blank before turning your Hard Maple bowl. The class is one full day. DMWT provides the tools and blanks, you provide the accessories and face shield. This is a one day class. Cost: \$20.

Basic Segmenting: This class will cover the basics of making segmented projects, from calculating segment angles and sizes, ring diameters needed, segment wood prep, gluing and clamping, to accurate cutting fixtures. You'll glue together furnished pre-cut segments and clamp them. Turning will be demonstrated but students won't be using the lathe in the class. Pre-cut segments for glue-up practice will be furnished. Bring paper and pencil to take notes. This is a one day class. Cost: \$20.

Basic Skew Chisel: This class will introduce students to the proper techniques and use of the tool as well as sharpening. Students will furnish their own skew chisel(s) (3/4 inch and up preferred). We will use the same accessories as in the Basic Woodturning Class. This is a one day class. Cost: \$20.

Basic Sharpening: The sharpening class will use lathe mounted sandpaper sharpening wheels and wooden dowels to teach the techniques of sharpening. This class is primarily for gouges but will also touch on a variety of other common traditional turning tools such as parting tools, skew, bedan and scrapers. In addition, sharpening hollowing tools, thread chasers, hook tools and common flat carbide cutters will be discussed. After practice, students will have the opportunity to sharpen their own tools using the Oneway Wolverine Sharpening system and CBN wheels. This is a one day class. Cost: \$20.

DMWT Woodturning Scholarship

The Des Moines Woodturners offer a scholarship program for the benefit of chapter members. Woodturning can be an expensive endeavor. The cost of equipment such as a lathe, bandsaw, chainsaw, sharpening system, buffing system and the myriad of items like drive centers, scroll chucks, live centers, adapters, jaws, and faceplates can mount rapidly. In addition is the cost of turning tools, embellishing tools, specialty tools and a host of accessories, supplies and finishing products, not to mention the cost of wood if you don't have the capacity to harvest your own.

By the same token, three and five day woodturning educational events are also expensive when located out-of-state. Travel costs, lodging and tuition can easily run \$1,000 to \$1,700 per event.

This scholarship is not intended as a source of financial aid for those who might otherwise not be able to afford the educational experience. Instead, it is offered as an incentive to those serious about woodturning who are willing to expand their skills and knowledge and bring those skill-sets back to share with our members in a variety of ways. The scholarship can provide recipients a 25% to 50% discount toward the overall cost of their attendance expenses.

The purpose of the scholarship is to expand personal woodturning skills and knowledge and share their experience with fellow members by:

- -Attending Chapter events and sharing their learning experience.
- -Showing examples of their work as a result of their learning experience.
- -Demonstrating what they learned at a chapter meeting, event, or class.
- -Sharing their overall learning experience and confidence building experience.
- -Encouraging members to expand their woodturning skills via similar educational experiences.
- -Volunteering for Chapter leadership positions (wide variety of opportunities).
