In the fall of 2009 at the Octagon Art Festival, I met **Rob Wallace**, a talented woodturner. Summary of Threading Demonstration

May 10, 2025 Chapter Meeting

Des Moines Woodturners monthly meeting demonstration, May 10, 2025, mall venue on Threading and presented by **Donna Byers, Chris Saleh, and Roger Nass**.

Chris Saleh demonstrated how he makes threads on vessels by the thread chasing method. He uses two different thread cutting tools, one for cutting the inside thread and one for cutting the outside threads. He also uses an armrest tool, and the threads are cut at 15 threads per inch. The best woods are hard woods like boxwood, Osage orange, and hard maple. He cuts the inside thread first as it is easier to fix later, if necessary, instead of the tenon threads. He hollowed out the vessel with a spindle gouge and cut a small relief to make an open area behind the threads on the top. He began cutting the inside threads at 350 rpm or slower if necessary to get a clean cut. He used the inside thread cutting tool to start the first thread and then let the tool pull itself into the vessel to cut the remaining threads. He then made a tenon for the outside cut and used a caliper to make the diameter the same dimension as the thread root depth of the vessel inside cut. If the tenon with the threads is too tight for the vessel inside cut it can be hand chased again to get the fit to fit properly.

Donna Byers demonstrated a threader made by Simon Hope from the Black Forest Company in Canada. It costs \$ 425 plus shipping. She cuts the threads at 3000 rpm and uses CA glue to strengthen the wood to get clean cuts for the threads. The difference between the inside thread dimension and the outside thread diameter is about 1.1 mm.

Roger Nass demonstrated a Baxter thread cutting tool made to fit a mini lathe. It cost \$625 from Best Wood Tools. He can cut threads on either with or cross grain wood. It uses a star shaped cutter at about 1800 rpm. It is easy to get the threads too tight; it is better to have the threads looser than too tight. He cuts the threads on the container first and cuts a relief groove at the base to allow the threads to fit the base without bottoming out. The relief groove can be cut on the tenon side instead of the base side. He uses a caliper to size the tenon. The thread depth is 0.025 inches. To get the tenon diameter to fit the base threads he cuts the tenon 0.046 inches greater in diameter than the inside diameter of the container or inside thread diameter. If the threads are too tight he can either recut the tenon threads or add a taper to the tenon threads to make the fit a little better.

I reviewed what blanks are available for spurtles, tops, and rolling pins and think we will have enough for 2026.

We will need more cedar blanks and funky pen blanks. We need to start harvesting cedar this fall so it will be dry enough for handing out next spring. **Stan Merrell** and I harvested some last April, and it is in the warehouse. I'm estimating it will be enough for 75 trees.

Cherry limbs also make good trees especially if it has spalted a little. I think honey locust branches could also make some interesting trees. Sycamore trees also sell well. I'm sure there are other species that would make interesting trees.

Will Zitterich Biography

Will Zitterich has studied and practiced woodworking for more than five decades. A civil engineer by trade, his creativity and appreciation for beauty comes out in his bowls, vases, vessels, and urns. A native of Iowa, he has dedicated his craft to many fundraisers, church functions, and school charitable events. He has donated numerous works of art to support ALS and Breast Cancer Awareness and Research. The Story County Freedom Flight enjoys his donations each year to support Iowa Veterans.

The products listed are all food safe and have a polyurethane finish. Polyurethane finishes are one of the most durable and scratch resistant finishes available. The number of coats of polyurethane finish vary with the item but all have a minimum of 4 coats and some have as many as 15 coats of polyurethane. Most of the items have a gloss finish but a few have a satin or semi-gloss finish.

Metallic and Acrylic paints are used on painted items and water soluble dyes in combination with the paints. All paints and dyes are placed on the wood bowls before any polyurethane is applied. The polyurethane protects and seals in the paints and dyes and prevents anything from rubbing them off and prevents any food from contacting the paints and dyes.

These bowls can be used for liquids for hours and then just wiped out when no longer needed. They should not be placed in the dishwasher or have extremely hot liquids placed in them. The vases are intended for dry flowers unless they have a glass liner.

Summary of Making and Finishing Urns Will Zitterich, June 14, 2025



Will Zitterich demonstrated the methods he uses to make an urn. He displayed several finished urns made from different woods with different shapes. It is possible to make an urn from any wood that can be turned into a hollow vessel, but if it is made from softer wood some steps need to be taken to harden the wood to cleanly cut the threads. He described how he cuts the threads at 10 threads per inch using a Baxter Jig.



He demonstrated how to hollow the vessel, cut the threads on the vessel opening, turn the urn top, cut the threads on the urn top, fit the threads on the urn top to properly match the threads on the urn vessel, turn the urn together with the urn top to make the final shape, and then finish the urn and urn top with polyurethane to a glossy finish.


He demonstrated how he finishes the urns to glossy surface. He re-mounted a finished urn on the lathe and sanded off the existing finish to bare wood using number 400 sandpaper at 600 rpm. After removing any scratches, sanding marks, or imperfections the urn is sanded again using number 600 sandpaper. After removing any sanding marks the urn is sanded again using number 800 sandpaper and is ready for a gloss polyurethane finish. While the urn turns slowly at about 50 rpm, the finish is applied with a foam brush. The urn continues to turn at 50 rpm until the finish is dry. This process can be repeated as necessary to obtain a satisfactory glossy finish.



Woodturning Classes

General Information: You will receive an information packet by email approximately 1 month before the class. It contains a list of required accessories, location and safety information. A reminder will arrive about 1 week before the class. The fee is collected on the day of the class. There is no penalty for cancellation, but please let us know ASAP if you have to cancel.

Basic Woodturning: If you have not taken Basic Woodturning you will find it useful if you're new to turning, been away from the lathe for awhile or would just like a refresher. Enhance your spindle turning skills. It is a fun day and a confidence builder. In addition, it is the prerequisite for the other courses. DWMT provides the tools and wood. Homework is assigned between classes so you will need access to a lathe. Basic Woodturning is two consecutive Mondays, 8:30 to 5. Cost: \$40.

Basic Bowl Turning: This class touches on basics of wood harvesting, differences from spindle turning, and introduces the bowl gouge. You will practice on a Poplar blank before turning your Hard Maple bowl. The class is one full day. DMWT provides the tools and blanks, you provide the accessories and face shield. This is a one day class. Cost: \$20.

Basic Segmenting: This class will cover the basics of making segmented projects, from calculating segment angles and sizes, ring diameters needed, segment wood prep, gluing and clamping, to accurate cutting fixtures. You'll glue together furnished pre-cut segments and clamp them. Turning will be demonstrated but students won't be using the lathe in the class. Pre-cut segments for glue-up practice will be furnished. Bring paper and pencil to take notes. This is a one day class. Cost: \$20.

Basic Skew Chisel: This class will introduce students to the proper techniques and use of the tool as well as sharpening. Students will furnish their own skew chisel(s) (3/4 inch and up preferred). We will use the same accessories as in the Basic Woodturning Class. This is a one day class. Cost: \$20.

Basic Sharpening: The sharpening class will use lathe mounted sandpaper sharpening wheels and wooden dowels to teach the techniques of sharpening. This class is primarily for gouges but will also touch on a variety of other common traditional turning tools such as parting tools, skew, bedan and scrapers. In addition, sharpening hollowing tools, thread chasers, hook tools and common flat carbide cutters will be discussed. After practice, students will have the opportunity to sharpen their own tools using the Oneway Wolverine Sharpening system and CBN wheels. This is a one day class. Cost: \$20.

Educational Opportunities

DMWT Woodturning Scholarship

The Des Moines Woodturners offer a scholarship program for the benefit of chapter members. Woodturning can be an expensive endeavor. The cost of equipment such as a lathe, bandsaw, chainsaw, sharpening system, buffing system and the myriad of items like drive centers, scroll chucks, live centers, adapters, jaws, and faceplates can mount rapidly. In addition is the cost of turning tools, embellishing tools, specialty tools and a host of accessories, supplies and finishing products, not to mention the cost of wood if you don't have the capacity to harvest your own.

By the same token, three and five day woodturning educational events are also expensive when located out-of-state. Travel costs, lodging and tuition can easily run \$1,000 to \$1,700 per event.

This scholarship is not intended as a source of financial aid for those who might otherwise not be able to afford the educational experience. Instead, it is offered as an incentive to those serious about woodturning who are willing to expand their skills and knowledge and bring those skill-sets back to share with our members in a variety of ways. The scholarship can provide recipients a 25% to 50% discount toward the overall cost of their attendance expenses.

The purpose of the scholarship is to expand personal woodturning skills and knowledge and share their experience with fellow members by:

- Attending Chapter events and sharing their learning experience.
- Showing examples of their work as a result of their learning experience.
- Demonstrating what they learned at a chapter meeting, event, or class.
- Sharing their overall learning experience and confidence building experience.
- Encouraging members to expand their woodturning skills via similar educational experiences.
- Volunteering for Chapter leadership positions (wide variety of opportunities).
