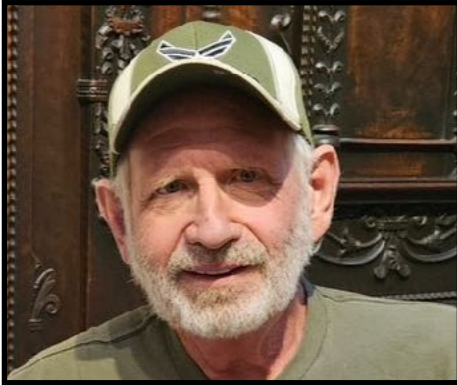

### Safety First When Turning Dennis Anderson, President

Everyone who turns wood on a lathe has had something go wrong at some point. Examples of things going wrong often serve as critical safety lessons for all of us. These incidents typically fall into categories involving mechanical failure, improper technique, or human error. Improper mounting of workpiece, hidden defects in the wood, excessive speed, not riding the bevel, unsupported cuts, using a wrong or dull tool, loose clothing or jewelry hazards, and more are frequent reasons for mishaps. Always remember the ABCs of woodturning—Anchor the tool, touch the Bevel, then start the Cut—and always wear an ANSI Z87+ rated full-face shield. Even experienced wood turners can make mistakes due to a lack of attention to detail. Always ensure your tools are sharp and your blanks are securely mounted to the lathe. Patience and practice are key in improving your craft.

## **Rob Wallace demonstration, Feb. 14, 2026**

### **USING SCRAPERS IN WOOD TURNING**

**Rob Wallace** began with a PowerPoint presentation showing the different kinds of scrapers, how they are used, and the difference between scraping and shearing cuts. He explained using traditional scrapers, negative rake scrapers, and using a scraper for a shearing or slicing cut.

**Rob Wallace** explained how the forces on the tool, tool rest, and the turner changes depending on the position of the tool rest and how the scraper is presented to the turning wood. He used a diagram to explain the resultant forces that occur on the tool and how critical the position of the tool rest is for effective turning. If the tool rest is at the centerline of the turning wood, the resultant force on the tool is directed down and resisted by the tool rest and not the turner. If the tool rest is higher than the centerline of the wood, the resultant force on the tool is directed back to the turner and not the tool rest. This makes the scraper much more difficult to use by the turner and it will be more difficult to get a good smooth cut on the wood.

**Rob** explained if the bevel is not used to support the cut results in a scraping cut. When scraping the tool is presented at a horizontal or negative angle at or below the centerline of the wood without the bevel touching the wood. If the scraper is presented at a positive angle or above the centerline, the scraper may be self-feeding and result in a bad catch of gouge cut out of the wood.

If the tool bevel is used to support the cut and the cutting tool is presented at a positive angle or above the horizontal angle, the resultant cut is a shearing cut. This is how a gouge is used. Using a scraper in a cutting position or using the bevel to support the cut results in shearing cut using a scraper.

**Rob** explained what makes a scraper a negative rake scraper. The negative rake scraper has a rake angle cut into the top edge of the scraper and a bevel edge angle cut on the bottom of the scraper. The angles can vary but the included angle should be less than 90 degrees. The negative rake scraper is presented at a horizontal angle. The negative rake scraper is easier to use as the top rake angle helps prevent the scraper from self-feeding.

Rob pointed out some very important things to remember; the tool rest position is critical; the burr is short-lived; and read the shavings. The shavings from shearing cuts are curls and the shavings from scraping cuts are small wood chips. His explanations were excellent, valuable, and useful to new and experienced turners alike.

## Support the Club - Turn Product for the State Fair

The club has blanks for many of the items that we need turned for the fair. We have a spreadsheet that we update when a member checks out blanks and turns in finished. This helps the club know if we are on target to meet our goals for the 2026 fair. Blanks are on the cart near the entry. Please let **Duane Groenenboom** or **Mark Hayes** know if you take blanks home or return finished items so we can update our inventory.

Bowls, naturals edge bowls and segmented bowls are State Fair blanks that we do not track but many of the other items we do provide and track blanks for the items below. Last year we sold about 400 simple pens. We have blanks with predrilled holes available for check out and need about 380 checked out to meet our target of 400.

Trees are our top revenue item and we are targeting to have 320 completed for the fair this year. We would like them to be 6" or taller. We sell basic trees for \$15 and more fancy trees will be priced at \$25, \$35, and \$45.

We have enough rolling pins carried over from last years fair so do not need any rolling pins turned this year.

Spurtle sales have been dropping the past few years but would still need about 80 turned for this year.

Tops are also high sales items, we already have about half of our target number or 225 turned in.

We also need 50 honey dippers turned. We have kits and instructions on how to turn them.

We also need about 50 nice pens turned this year. Talk to **Dan Carlson** if you need pen kits.

Christmas ornaments are also good sellers but currently we are only counting items as they come in.

Please remember the State Fair brings in the most revenue for the club and is used to keep membership, training cost low as well and pays for rent, and professional demonstrators.

## Training News

### Woodturning Classes

**General Information:** You will receive an information packet by email approximately 1 month before the class. It contains a list of required accessories, location and safety information. A reminder will arrive about 1 week before the class. The fee is collected on the day of the class. There is no penalty for cancellation, but please let us know ASAP if you have to cancel.

**Basic Woodturning:** If you have not taken Basic Woodturning you will find it useful if you're new to turning, been away from the lathe for awhile or would just like a refresher. Enhance your spindle turning skills. It is a fun day and a confidence builder. In addition, it is the prerequisite for the other courses. DWMT provides the tools and wood. Homework is assigned between classes so you will need access to a lathe. Basic Woodturning is two consecutive Mondays, 8:30 to 5. Cost: \$40.

**Basic Bowl Turning:** This class touches on basics of wood harvesting, differences from spindle turning, and introduces the bowl gouge. You will practice on a Poplar blank before turning your Hard Maple bowl. The class is one full day. DWMT provides the tools and blanks, you provide the accessories and face shield. This is a one day class. Cost: \$20.

**Basic Segmenting:** This class will cover the basics of making segmented projects, from calculating segment angles and sizes, ring diameters needed, segment wood prep, gluing and clamping, to accurate cutting fixtures. You'll glue together furnished pre-cut segments and clamp them. Turning will be demonstrated but students won't be using the lathe in the class. Pre-cut segments for glue-up practice will be furnished. Bring paper and pencil to take notes. This is a one day class. Cost: \$20.

**Basic Skew Chisel:** This class will introduce students to the proper techniques and use of the tool as well as sharpening. Students will furnish their own skew chisel(s) (3/4 inch and up preferred). We will use the same accessories as in the Basic Woodturning Class. This is a one day class. Cost: \$20.

**Basic Sharpening:** The sharpening class will use lathe mounted sandpaper sharpening wheels and wooden dowels to teach the techniques of sharpening. This class is primarily for gouges but will also touch on a variety of other common traditional turning tools such as parting tools, skew, bedan and scrapers. In addition, sharpening hollowing tools, thread chasers, hook tools and common flat carbide cutters will be discussed. After practice, students will have the opportunity to sharpen their own tools using the Oneway Wolverine Sharpening system and CBN wheels. This is a one day class. Cost: \$20.

## **Educational Opportunities**

### **DMWT Woodturning Scholarship**

The Des Moines Woodturners offer a scholarship program for the benefit of chapter members. Woodturning can be an expensive endeavor. The cost of equipment such as a lathe, bandsaw, chainsaw, sharpening system, buffing system and the myriad of items like drive centers, scroll chucks, live centers, adapters, jaws, and faceplates can mount rapidly. In addition is the cost of turning tools, embellishing tools, specialty tools and a host of accessories, supplies and finishing products, not to mention the cost of wood if you don't have the capacity to harvest your own.

By the same token, three and five day woodturning educational events are also expensive when located out-of-state. Travel costs, lodging and tuition can easily run \$1,000 to \$1,700 per event.

This scholarship is not intended as a source of financial aid for those who might otherwise not be able to afford the educational experience. Instead, it is offered as an incentive to those serious about woodturning who are willing to expand their skills and knowledge and bring those skill-sets back to share with our members in a variety of ways. The scholarship can provide recipients a 25% to 50% discount toward the overall cost of their attendance expenses.

The purpose of the scholarship is to expand personal woodturning skills and knowledge and share their experience with fellow members by:

- Attending Chapter events and sharing their learning experience.
- Showing examples of their work as a result of their learning experience.
- Demonstrating what they learned at a chapter meeting, event, or class.
- Sharing their overall learning experience and confidence building experience.
- Encouraging members to expand their woodturning skills via similar educational experiences.
- Volunteering for Chapter leadership positions (wide variety of opportunities).
